For more than 25 years, Lucy Salcido Carter has worked with nonprofits, public agencies, and foundations to advocate for better laws, improve public systems, and implement innovative programs for a wide range of issues including child welfare, violence prevention, higher education, racial equity, and criminal justice. Her accomplishments include successful legislative campaigns to ensure access to technology for foster youth, to require postsecondary education programs for high school graduates in juvenile detention, to strengthen legal claims of innocence in criminal cases, and to increase compensation and services for exonerees. She has published numerous articles on topics such as wrongful convictions, teen sexting, drugexposed infants, and child exposure to domestic violence. In her former role as program officer at the David and Lucile Packard Foundation, she supported early efforts to develop Effective Intervention in Domestic Violence & Child Maltreatment Cases: Guidelines for Policy and Practice and edited a Future of Children journal issue on Domestic Violence and Children. She recently co-edited, with Jeffrey L. Edleson, the Juvenile and Family Court Journal's special issue celebrating 20 years since publication of the guidelines.
