Racial Inequality	Executive Order On Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities Through the Federal Government ( <u>text</u> )	1/21/2021	Biden ordered his government to conduct equity assessments of its agencies and reallocate resources to "advanc[e] equity for all, including people of color and others who have been historically underserved, marginalized and adversely affected by persistent poverty and inequality."
Pandemic Response & Inequality	Executive Order Ensuring an Equitable Pandemic Response and Recovery (text)	1/21/2021	Biden explains the creation of an HHS COVID-19 Health Equity Task Force comprised of agency heads, and up to 20 members from private entities. The goal of the Task Force is to "provide specific recommendations to the President, through the Coordinator of the COVID-19 Response and Counselor to the President (COVID-19 Response Coordinator), for mitigating the health inequities caused or exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic and for preventing such inequities in the future."

Gender Equality & Military Personnel	Executive Order on Enabling All Qualified Americans to Serve Their Country in Uniform (text)	1/25/2021	Biden repealed the ban on transgender people serving openly in the military and ordered the defense secretary to "immediately prohibit involuntary separations, discharges and denials of reenlistment or continuation of service on the basis of gender identity or under circumstances relating to their gender identity."
Native American Inclusion	Memorandum on Tribal Consultation and Strengthening Nation-to-Nation Relationships (text)	1/26/2021	This memorandum orders OMB to deliver a detailed plan of action that it will take to implement directive from Executive Order 13175 of 2000, which "charges all executive departments and agencies with engaging in regular, meaningful, and robust consultation with Tribal officials in the development of Federal policies that have Tribal implications."
Prison Reform	Executive Order on Reforming Our Incarceration System to Eliminate the Use of Privately Operated Criminal Detention Facilities (text)	1/26/2021	This order will phase out the Federal Government's reliance private prisons and reduce profit-based incentives to incarcerate individuals. It also encourages rehabilitation and redemption. Notably, it instructs the attorney general not to renew any Department of Justice contracts with private prisons.
Racial Inequality	Memorandum Condemning and Combating Racism, Xenophobia, and Intolerance Against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the United States (text)	1/26/2021	This memorandum charges HHS with "issuing guidance describing best practices for advancing cultural competency, language access, and sensitivity towards Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the context of the Federal Government's COVID-19 response." It also encourages the attorney general, executive agencies, and departments to monitor discrimination.
Housing Inequality	Memorandum on Redressing Our Nation's and the Federal Government's History of Discriminatory Housing Practices and Policies (text)	1/26/2021	Biden aims to close gaps in housing inequality. Specifically, it instructs HUD to look into the impact of its anti-discrimination policies, especially the "Preserving Community and Neighborhood Choice" rule.

LGBTQIA+ Rights	Memorandum on Advancing the Human Rights of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, and Intersex Persons Around the World (text)	2/4/2021	This Memorandum builds on guidance first issued by President Obama in 2011, and directs relevant federal agencies to engage constructively to advance protections for the human rights of LGBTQI+ persons abroad.
Religious Inclusion	Executive Order on the Establishment of the White House Office of Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships (text)	2/14/2021	This order ( <u>fact sheet</u> ) will work with civil society to disseminate information regarding COVID vaccines, combat systematic racism, increase opportunities for disadvantaged communities, and advance global humanitarian work.
Voter Expansion	Executive Order on Promoting Access to Voting ( <u>text</u> )	3/7/2021	As explained in this <u>fact sheet</u> , this EO will direct federal agencies to expand access to voter registration and election information, assist states under the National Voter Registration Act, improve and modernize Vote.gov, increase federal employees' access to voting, and a Native American voting rights steering group, among other items.
LGBTQIA+ Rights	Executive Order on Establishment of the White House Gender Policy Council (text)	3/8/2021	This EO establishes a gender council to combat systemic bias and discrimination, including sexual harassment. It requires the Co-Chairs of the Council to submit to the President a Government-wide strategy to address gender in policies, programs and budgets, and an annual report to measure progress on implementing the strategy.
LGBTQIA+ Rights	Executive Order on Guaranteeing an Educational Environment Free from Discrimination on the Basis of Sex, Including Sexual Orientation or Gender Identity (text)	3/8/2021	This EO directs the Department of Education (ED) to review all of its existing regulations, orders, guidance, and policies to ensure consistency with the Biden-Harris Administration's policy that students be guaranteed education free from sexual violence.

Anti-Asian Violence	President Biden Announces Additional Actions to Respond to Anti-Asian Violence, Xenophobia and Bias ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	3/30/2021	This plan includes: (1) reinstating the White House Initiative on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders; (2) funding for AAPI survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault; (3) establishing a COVID-19 Equity Task Force committee on addressing and ending xenophobia against Asian Americans; (4) establishing a Department of Justice cross-agency initiative to address anti-Asian violence; (5) launching a new virtual bookshelf of federally-funded projects that explore and celebrate Asian Americans' contributions to the United States; and (6) funding research to prevent and address bias and xenophobia against Asian American communities.
Older Americans	Biden-Harris Administration Delivers Funds to Support the Health of Older Americans (fact sheet)	5/3/2021	HHS's Administration for Community Living is releasing \$1.4 billion in funding from the American Rescue Plan for Older Americans Act programs, including programs to support vaccine outreach and coordination, address social isolation, provide family caregiver support, and offer nutrition support. It will also fund justice programs to ensure the safety and protection of older adults.
Justice Department	President Biden to Sign Presidential Memorandum to Expand Access to Legal Representation and the Courts (fact sheet)	5/18/2021	This EO will include plans to expand the DOJ's access to justice work and will re-establish the White House Legal Aid Interagency Roundtable.
Wealth Gap	Biden-Harris Administration Announces New Actions to Build Black Wealth and Narrow the Racial Wealth Gap ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	6/1/2021	The Biden Administration is taking action to address racial discrimination in the housing market, including by launching a first-of-its-kind interagency effort to address inequity in home appraisals, and conducting rulemaking to aggressively combat housing discrimination. The Administration also pledges to grow federal contracting with small disadvantaged businesses by 50 percent, translating to an additional \$100 billion over five years, and helping more Americans realize their entrepreneurial dreams.

LGBTQIA+ Rights	President Biden Announces U.S. Special Envoy to Advance the Human Rights of LGBTQI+ Persons (text)	6/25/2021	Ahead of his remarks at the White House for Pride Month, President Biden announced that he will appoint Jessica Stern to be the U.S. Special Envoy to Advance the Human Rights of LGBTQI+ Persons at the Department of State.
Federal Workforce Inclusion	Executive Order on Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility in the Federal Workforce (text)	6/25/2021	This Order (fact sheet) will establish a government-wide initiative to advance diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility in all parts of the Federal workforce. It also charges all agencies with assessing the current state of diversity, equity, inclusion and accessibility within their workforces, and developing strategic plans to eliminate any barriers to success faced by underserved employees. Among other things, the Order also promotes agencies' Chief Diversity Officers and training within their organizations, addresses workplace harassment, reduces reliance on unpaid internships, advances pay equity, includes a more diverse pipeline into public service, expands employment opportunities for formerly incarcerated individuals, and improves demographic data about the Federal workforce.

Climate Change	Paris Climate Agreement ( <u>text</u> )	1/20/2021	Biden reentered the Paris Climate agreement.
Climate Change	Executive Order on Protecting Public Health and the Environment and Restoring Science to Tackle the Climate Crisis (text)	1/20/2021	Alongside a variety of actions to "advance environmental justice," Biden revoked the permit for the controversial Keystone XL pipeline — a 1,200-mile pipeline system projected to carry crude oil from Canada to the U.S. that cuts through Indigenous lands. The measure also restored several national monuments whose footprints were reduced by Trump and paused oil and gas leasing in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

Climate Change	Executive Order on Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad (text)	1/27/2021	This lengthy and comprehensive order, broken down in this fact sheet, centers the climate crisis in U.S. foreign policy and national security considerations. It also establishes a "White House Office of Domestic Climate Policy – led by the first-ever National Climate Advisor and Deputy National Climate Advisor" and leverages federal buying power to rebuild infrastructure in a sustainable way, advance conservation efforts, and focus on energy economies. This executive summary was released on April 22.
Climate Change	Memorandum on Restoring Trust in Government Through Scientific Integrity and Evidence-Based Policymaking ( <u>text</u> )	1/27/2021	This order "directs agencies to make evidence-based decisions guided by the best available science and data." Agencies that conduct or oversee research must also "designating a senior agency employee as Chief Science Officer to ensure agency research programs are scientifically and technologically well founded and conducted with integrity."
Climate Change	Executive Order on the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (text)	1/27/2021	This order re-establishes the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (PCAST). The PCAST– co-chaired by the President's Science Advisor – will advise the President on policy that affects science, technology, and innovation.
Climate & Jobs	Biden-Harris Administration Launches American Innovation Effort to Create Jobs and Tackle the Climate Crisis ( <u>text</u> )	2/11/2021	The Biden-Harris Administration is initiating creating a Climate Innovation Working Group as part of the National Climate Task Force. This announcement also includes an outline of the Administration's climate and Working Group agenda and a new \$100 million funding opportunity from the U.S. Department of Energy to support low-carbon energy technologies.

The Coal Industry	Readout of the White House's First Interagency Working Group on Coal and Power Plant Communities and Economic Revitalization (text)	2/26/2021	As a follow-up on the January 27 EO (text), this first meeting of the Interagency Working Group on Coal and Power Plant Communities and Economic Revitalization discussed ideas and actions at their respective agencies and offices to determine how to deploy grants, federal loan program, technical assistant, financing, procurement, and other programs that will support and revitalize the economies of coal and power plant communities.
Offshore Wind	Biden Administration Jumpstarts Offshore Wind Energy Projects to Create Jobs ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	3/30/2021	The Biden Administration took steps to advance wind energy projects to create good paying, union jobs, invest in infrastructure to strengthen the domestic supply chain, and support research and development and data-sharing.

It includes job creation efforts, domestic manufacturing, and changes to the fuel economy.

According to the Administration, these initial areas for offshore wind development in the Pacific Ocean could bring up to 4.6 gigawatts of clean energy to the grid, enough to power 1.6 million American homes.

While the president lacks the authority to institute a nationwide mask mandate, the order also "encourage[s] masking across America."
Pandemic Response	Executive Order on Organizing and Mobilizing the United States Government to Provide a Unified and Effective Response to Combat COVID-19 and to Provide United States Leadership on Global Health and Security (text)	1/20/2021	After the U.S. surpassed 400,000 COVID-19 deaths earlier this month, Biden's order created the position of Covid-19 response coordinator, who will advise the president and oversee the distribution of vaccines, tests and other supplies.

Pandemic Response & Housing	Extend Eviction and Foreclosure Moratoriums ( <u>text</u> )	1/20/2021	Biden asked the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to immediately extend the federal eviction moratorium until at least March 31, 2021, while calling on Congress to provide rental assistance and extend the moratorium further.
Pandemic Response	Executive Order on Promoting COVID-19 Safety in Domestic and International Travel ( <u>text</u> )	1/21/2021	In an effort to curb the spread of Covid-19 through travel, Biden mandated mask-wearing on all forms of public transportation, including in airports, airplanes and buses.
Pandemic Response	National Security Directive on United States Global Leadership to Strengthen the International COVID-19 Response and to Advance Global Health Security and Biological Preparedness (text)	1/21/2021	This statement strengthens the U.S. commitment to the World Health Organization (WHO) through increasing financing of the WHO and biodefense, supporting he COVID-19 Vaccine Global Access (COVAX) Facility, and advancing global epidemic and pandemic preparedness.
Pandemic Response	Executive Order on Improving and Expanding Access to Care and Treatments for COVID-19 (text)	1/21/2021	Biden's order has directed the secretary of health to support research on Covid-19 treatments and increase support for critical care and long-term care facilities like nursing homes — which have been among the sites hit hardest by the pandemic.
Pandemic Response	Executive Order on Ensuring a Data-Driven Response to COVID-19 and Future High-Consequence Public Health Threats (text)	1/21/2021	Another of Biden's orders on the nation's Covid-19 response directed all department and agency heads to "facilitate the gathering, sharing and publication of Covid-19-related data" in order to inform their decision-making and public understanding of the pandemic.
Pandemic Response & Military Personnel	Memorandum to Extend Federal Support to Governors' Use of the National Guard to Respond to COVID-19 and to Increase Reimbursement and Other Assistance Provided to States (text)	1/21/2021	Biden's memorandum directed the secretaries of defense and homeland security to support governors' deployment of the National Guard in efforts to prevent the spread of the coronavirus, which will be fully funded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Public Health Supply Chain	Executive Order on a Sustainable Public Health Supply Chain ( <u>text</u> )	1/21/2021	Biden's order requested the heads of various departments to assess the nationwide availability of personal protective equipment and other resources needed to distribute Covid-19 tests and coronavirus vaccines, as well as to develop a strategy to manufacture supplies for "future pandemics and biological threats."
Pandemic Response	Executive Order on Protecting Worker Health and Safety ( <u>text</u> )	1/21/2021	Biden's order directed the Department of Labor to revise and issue new guidance for employers to promote the health and safety of their workers, focusing on combatting the pandemic. Provisions include mask-wearing in the workplace, launching a COVID-specific OSHA program, and outlining impacted sectors.
Pandemic Response	Executive Order on Establishing the COVID-19 Pandemic Testing Board and Ensuring a Sustainable Public Health Workforce for COVID-19 and Other Biological Threats (text)	1/21/2021	Biden's newly created pandemic testing board will coordinate national efforts to "promote Covid-19 diagnostic, screening and surveillance testing" as well as facilitate the distribution of free Covid-19 tests to those without comprehensive health insurance.
Public Health	Letter to His Excellency António Guterres ( <u>text</u> )	1/20/2021	This letter rejoins the U.S. into the World Health Organization (WHO).
Pandemic Response	Executive Order on Economic Relief Related to the COVID-19 Pandemic (text)	1/22/2021	Biden's order directed all government departments and agencies to "promptly identify actions they can take within existing authorities to address the current economic crisis resulting from the pandemic." According to a fact sheet, this order will, among other items, ask "the U.S. Department of Labor to consider clarifying that workers who refuse unsafe working conditions can still receive unemployment insurance," and encourages that USDA to "consider issuing new guidance that would allow states to increase SNAP emergency allotments for those who need it most."

Pandemic Response	Proclamation on the Suspension of Entry as Immigrants and Non- Immigrants of Certain Additional Persons Who Pose a Risk of Transmitting Coronavirus Disease (text)	1/25/2021	Biden reinstated Covid-19 travel restrictions affecting non-U.S. citizens traveling from Brazil and much of Europe, which Trump had scrapped days before his term ended. Additionally, the ban will bar most non-U.S. citizens from entry if they have recently been in South Africa, where a new strain of Covid-19 has been identified.
Education & School Reopening	Executive Order Supporting the Reopening and Continuing Operation of Schools and Early Childhood Education Providers (text)	1/21/2021	The goal of this order is to mitigate learning loss, ensure high quality care and education, and work towards safe in-person learning. The Secretary of Education is instructed to work with HHS to develop safe guidance and practices and determine a reopening timeline. It also develops a "Safer Schools and Campuses Best Practices Clearinghouse to enable schools and institutions of higher education to share lessons learned and best practices for operating safely during the pandemic"
FEMA Assistance	Memorandum on Maximizing Assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (text)	2/2/2021	This order ( <u>fact sheet</u> ) will increase weekly vaccine supply to states, Tribes, and territories to 10.5 million doses nationwide beginning this week. This is a 22% increase since January 20. It also launces the first phase of the Federal Retail Pharmacy Program for COVID-19 Vaccination and increases reimbursement to states.
Navajo Nation	President Joseph R. Biden Approves the Navajo Nation Disaster Declaration ( <u>text</u> )	2/3/2021	Biden declared that a major disaster exists for the Navajo Nation and ordered federal assistance to supplement the Tribe's efforts in the areas affected by COVID-19 beginning on January 20, 2020, and continuing.
COVID Testing	Biden Administration Announces Actions to Expand COVID-19 Testing ( <u>text</u> )	2/17/2021	This testing expansion ( <u>fact sheet</u> ) works to serve schools and underserved populations, increase domestic manufacturing of testing supplies, and increase virus genome sequencing.
Global Public Health	President Biden to Take Action on Global Health through Support of COVAX and Calling for Health Security Financing (fact sheet)	2/19/2021	At the G7, Biden announced that he will further contribute to COVAX and bolster COVID-19 related global health and vaccination initiatives.

Paycheck Protection Program	Biden Administration Announces Changes to PPP ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	2/22/2021	The Biden-Harris administration is instituting a 14-day period, starting February 24, during which only businesses with fewer than 20 employees can apply for relief through the Program.
Pandemic Response & Supply Chains	Executive Order on America's Supply Chains ( <u>text</u> )	2/24/2021	This order directs an immediate 100-day review across federal agencies with the goal of addressing supply chain vulnerabilities in four key areas, including: (1) pharmaceuticals and active pharmaceutical ingredients (API); (2) critical minerals; (3) semiconductors and advanced packaging; and (4) large capacity batteries, such as those used in electric vehicles.
Pandemic Response	Notice on the Continuation of the National Emergency Concerning the COVID-19 Pandemic ( <u>text</u> )	2/24/2021	The notice extends the national emergency declared on March 13, 2020, and beginning March 1, 2020, to continue in effect beyond March 1, 2021.
Pandemic Response	New Actions to Deliver Masks to Communities Hit Hard by the Pandemic ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	2/24/2021	The announcement commits to deliver more than 25 million masks to over 1,300 Community Health Centers across the country as well as 60,000 food pantries and soup kitchens.
Vaccine Efforts	441 Federally-Supported Community Vaccination Centers in First Month of Biden-Harris Administration (text)	2/26/2021	This offers an update on the Administration's launch of federally supported community vaccination centers. Native American Health	Biden Administration Invests \$4 Billion in American Rescue Plan Funding to Combat COVID-19 in Indian Country ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	4/16/2021	This funding from the American Rescue Plan includes \$600 Million to increase COVID-19 vaccinations in Indian Country, \$1 billion to detect, diagnose, trace, monitor, and mitigate COVID-19 infections, and \$2 billion for tribal health systems due to lost reimbursements for care during the pandemic.
COVID Variants	Biden Administration Announces \$1.7 Billion Investment to Fight COVID-19 Variants ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	4/16/2021	This allocation includes \$1 billion to expand genomic sequencing, \$400 million to support innovation initiatives including the launch of new innovative Centers of Excellence in Genomic Epidemiology, and \$300 million to build and support a National Bioinformatics Infrastructure. It also includes a state funding breakdown.
Vaccine Efforts	President Biden to Announce Goal to Administer at Least One Vaccine Shot to 70% of the U.S. Adult Population by July 4th ( <u>fact sheet</u> )	5/4/2021	To achieve this goal, President Biden plans to strengthen access to vaccines, support community education and outreach, focus on rural community, and launch a plan vaccinate adolescents.
