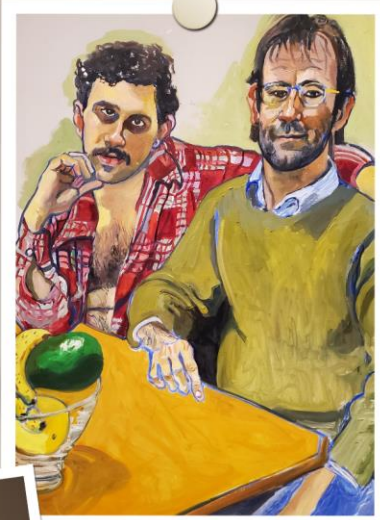

Morning Glory thermal spring is still as awe-inspiring as it was when I saw it as a small child.

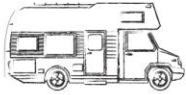
Being from Montana, I was lucky to visit this park often in my youth.

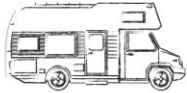




We explored Bryce Canyon on e-bikes to thwart the crowds. Best thing ever!
