A. THE CHURCH AND COMMUNITY

1. Our Church Hallmarks – First and foremost, we are a praying church. We are a friendly church with a Christ centered message. We are loving and welcoming to all who choose to attend our services. Our congregation consists of hard-working trades people, educators, farmers, professionals, as well as active retired folk. We have welcomed racial and ethnic families into our services and into membership. We are aware of and actively embrace special needs children and adults.

Our Church Property – We were founded in 1869; our heritage is very rich. After 152 years, on October 28, 2021, our church building caught on fire. We are in the process of rebuilding the part that was burned as well as the areas receiving smoke/water damage. We pray the construction will be complete by the end of the year. We have a vibrant Rebuild Committee working to ensure our new building is equipped with new technology and code upgrades. We have 8 Sunday school rooms, dining hall, kitchen, restrooms, pastor's office, copy room, storage rooms, chapel, music room, cemetery, sanctuary with piano and organ, a Session room, 2 paved parking lots.

Our Manse Property – It is in a beautiful, rural setting; it is just off Interstate 75, almost halfway between Atlanta and Chattanooga, about an hour's drive either way. It's the best of both worlds. It is situated on 7 acres of beautiful land and is complete with a softball field, playscape, fire circle area for fellowship, space for a garden, and a large shed for storage. The manse is a traditional ranch home with 3 bedrooms, 2 full bathrooms, gas log fireplace, full basement. The house will be "freshened up" after our present pastor and his family have moved.

- 2. Our Community We are only an hour away from 2 major cities. It is a beautiful, mostly rural community. There are scenic pastures with lots of cows; we have people who are enormously caring and loving who take care of one another. It is close to many historical, cultural, and educational opportunities including Tellus Science Museum, Booth Western Art Museum, Bartow History Museum, and the newly opened Savoy Automobile Museum. Some of the arts programs available in the community are the Grand Theater, Pumphouse Players, and Cartersville School of Ballet. In adjacent cities we have the World of Coca Cola, Fox Theater. Atlanta Braves/Falcons, aquariums, Lookout Mountain, hiking, rafting, biking, as well as other adventures in surrounding areas. We have magnet, college preparatory, vocational, STEM certified schools, and Georgia Highlands College, Shorter University, Berry College, Kennesaw State University, Emory University, Georgia Tech, and Georgia State University are all within an hours' drive. Excellent hospitals (Redmond Park, Piedmont, Northside, WellStar, and Emory) are located within a 45-60-minute drive. Churches in the area include Cedar Creek Baptist, Pine Log United Methodist, Glade Baptist, Oak Hill Baptist, Mount Pleasant Baptist and New Hope Baptist, The technology is not the best in our area. We basically operate in the neighborhoods via satellite service. We need better, stable and more reliable wi-fi to telecast our services on Sundays. The children need it to complete virtual school assignments. This is also difficult to do with the service available in our area.
- B. PROGRAM AREAS IN THE LIFE OF OUR CHURCH We use a Sunday in late summer as Camp Sunday allowing the children & youth who attended camp to show the congregation about their camp experience and encourages support of our camp programs. We engage in many programs with our community Pine Log Elementary School. We are involved with the Read To Grow Program helping the students to increase their reading skills; we participate in the Summer Feeding Program, ensuring all children have lunch and breakfast throughout the summer months. We assist the school with Pine Log Christmas to make certain all needy families have toys and clothes for their children and a ham on the table Christmas Day. We worked diligently to start a health clinic in Guatemala, showing our commitment to missions.

C. WORSHIP PREFERENCES

Traditional: We still love to sing traditional hymns, cling to bulletins, and recite liturgy. We practice for choir specials and for hand bell presentations.

Blended: We use some contemporary music that includes guitar, horn, drum, and some audio-visual displays.

D. GOALS, OBJECTIVES, VIEWPOINTS – We want to continually reach out to as many lost people as possible. In the next 5-10 years, we want to continue community programs and taking care of the members of our community. As members of our congregation are getting older, we will have a need to elect additional elders. We want to navigate the technological world without losing the integrity of our church family. We will need to revamp our church website so it will continue to be updated, fresh and carry current information.

E. BENEVOLENCE SUPPORT – Since Covid has been in existence, our percentage of annual total offerings has dropped to 13.7%. Prior to Covid, we generally gave around 20%. Due to the relaxing of the Covid regulations, the benevolent funds will increase for the year. We will again buy school supplies for the children at Pine Log Elementary School, we will again start Backpack Buddies (Filling bookbags with food for needy children to take home over the weekends), we will provide food for the Adairsville Food Bank, send clothes to the Adairsville Clothes Closet and to the Church Shop. We will also continue our monthly gifts to the Guatemala Clinic.


