#### A. THE CHURCH AND COMMUNITY

- 1. The Church
- a. The church is a 3300 (roughly) square foot building located on a spacious1-acre lot. It has a large open kitchen/dining area where many fellowship activities are held. It is a small, warm, and inviting church where everyone knows each other by name. The church consists of 6 available Sunday School rooms and can seat approximately 100 people in the Sanctuary. The outside has a large pavilion where outside events are held. The average age of the membership is 70+.
  - 2. The Community
    - a. The church is located in Cunningham, TN. Cunningham is an unincorporated community in Montgomery County, Tennessee, United States. It is located approximately 9.5 miles south of downtown Clarksville, at the intersection of State Route 13 and State Route 48. Cunningham has a post office, with ZIP code 37052. The population of the Cunningham Community is 3,119 with 53% being female and 47% male. The median age is 43.5. There are many churches located in the community with various denominations. There are 2 Elementary Schools, 1 Middle School and 1 High School.

#### **B. PROGRAM AREAS IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH**

1. Over the years, Locust Grove has had many different activities that include worship, fellowship, Christian education, evangelism, stewardship, and missions. Some of those include Homecoming celebration, Ice Cream Supper, Gospel Singings, Harvest Supper, Christmas Program, decorating the Christmas Tree, movie nights, hayride, Vacation Bible School, and many more. All activities and program implementation goes through the Board of Elders which is apprised of three members. The Board of Elders meets once a quarter and more often as needed.

#### C. WORSHIP PREFERENCES

1. Our current worship style is traditional with 30 minutes of singing and 30 minutes of preaching. The search committee does not think the congregation would have any issues with a blended worship style, but they might be opposed to a contemporary worship style.

## D. GOALS, OBJECTIVES, VIEWPOINTS

- 1. The goal at Locust Grove is to educate its members and others by teaching the sovereignty of God, the authority of the Scriptures, and the necessity of grace through faith in Christ.
- 2. The biggest issue we are currently facing at Locust Grove is the age of our membership. We are in desperate need of growth to keep the church alive. Since the average age of our membership is 70+, we need younger members to join so the church will be able to continue after the current membership passes.

## E. BENEVOLENCE SUPPORT

- 1. Locust Grove gives roughly 22% of its annual offerings to benevolent causes such as OUO, Nashville Presbytery, Manna Café and Urban Ministries. There are no plans to increase or decrease any support currently.
