## **A. THE CHURCH AND COMMUNITY**

### **1. The Church**

Stonegate Church meets in a building of modern architecture. It sits on approximately 4.5 acres on a highly travelled roadway. Our large LED sign is in front of the building. The sanctuary features high peaked ceilings with stained glass windows in the front. The chairs are in rows on an angle facing the altar and pulpit. The chairs are individual and can be rearranged. There is a Pastor's office and an office/classroom behind the sanctuary. In addition, there is a small children's area and a flexible classroom/meeting space. In the back of the church is a large fellowship hall that spans the length of the building. It is used for meetings, fellowship dinners, breakfast, and Bible Study as well as community functions, such as elections and neighborhood associations. We also encourage its use as our extended home for anniversaries, birthdays, showers, etc.

Stonegate's vision statement is "A Place to Experience the Love of Christ in Community" and the members are committed to welcome and care for each person who enters the fellowship. Most of our members are in the 60-80 age bracket. At present, there are about 30 committed members. There is one young couple with a baby, but the rest are empty nesters and/or retired.

### **2. The Community**

There are 183,150 people within a 5-mile radius of the church, in an area described as affluent. The Edmond Schools are highly rated. More than 50% of the adult population is college educated. There are two universities in the area as well as several hospitals and cultural facilities. There are at least 4 megachurches in the area as well as many smaller churches. Approximately 81% of the population claims a religious preference, but many are not attending any church. The community is very diverse.

## **B. PROGRAM AREAS IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH**

Since COVID, the program areas of the church are limited to worship, Bible Study, fellowship events and Friday Breakfast. Fellowship activities are important to the membership. We have monthly Bingo and regular special fellowship dinners. Members are invited to eat lunch together whenever there is a 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday. Each member has an active role in the duties of the church and the session coordinates the activities.

The goal of Stonegate Church is to be "A Place to Experience the Love of Christ in Community" It is our desire to know and care for each other as a community-every day and not just on Sunday. Our greatest asset is that we welcome people as they are. Our goal is to love as Christ loved and follow Him. Our greatest challenge is the aging of our members. We need more members under 60.

**E. BENEVOLENCE SUPPORT**

Stonegate Church is committed to paying our OUO. We support the homeless and the Choctaw ministries of two of our members. We also are committed to take care of the needs of those in our congregation when they are sick, disabled or without necessary funds.
