PART IV-NARRATIVE INFORMATION

A. THE CHURCH AND COMMUNITY

1. The Church

Virtue Church has continuously served the local community since its founding In 1887. It has historically been a rural church serving a farming community: however. in recent years the community has rapidly taken on more suburban characteristics. A broad mix of occupations is represented in the membership, with only a few still being associated with agriculture. There is currently no minority representation.

The present church was built in 1963, and an expansion of the fellowship hall was completed in the early 1980's. The church owns 12 acres of land surrounding the sanctuary site, part of which is used by the membership and other community groups for various forms of recreation. It contains a fenced softball field and a covered pavilion for outside services.

A Family Life Center was built in 1991. at a cost of \$350,000. It contains six Sunday School classrooms, three offices used by the pastor and church staff, a kitchen, restrooms and a multipurpose fellowship hall/auditorium/gymnasium. This act of faith was accomplished through gifts, pledges, and a \$150,000 denominational loan. This loan was paid off in the year 2000, and another loan of \$1 00,000 was secured for sanctuary renovation, which was completed in 2003. The church is currently debt-free.

Our congregation is characterized by strong fellowship with interpersonal relationships developed in activities of the church beyond regular worship services. We have a well- qualified part-time music director and sponsor monthly gospel music programs that are well attended by the community.

2. The Community

The church is located approximately 15 miles west from downtown Knoxville. Since the Knox County portion of our community was incorporated as the Town of Farragut in 1980, residential development has accelerated to the point that the public school system is continually facing the need for expansion of facilities. Most of the residential development is catering to upper middle class families. Several new churches of various denominations have been established and others are underway. Two other Cumberland Presbyterian churches located with In 5 miles serve a portion of the community. Our situation provides excellent growth potential along with the usual problems of rapid suburban expansion.

B. PROGRAM AREAS IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

Members of our 5-member session serve 3-year terms. There are currently four operating committees: Building and grounds, Christian education. Missions and evangelism and Music and worship. Various mission programs are actively supported by both our Day Circle and Night Circle of CP Women. The emphasis of our Men's Fellowship is more toward meeting local needs. Our Sunshine group of seniors makes monthly trips to regional areas of Interest.

D. GOALS, OBJECTIVES, VIEWPOINTS

At Virtue Church, We are serving God by creating disciples, through biblical teaching and loving fellowship in order to have an impact on our community.
