The Old Testament records the problems David faced, too. Some problems were self-inflicted because he made bad decisions, and many times, his very life was in danger. In the middle of all of it, he chose to trust God for forgiveness and protection. And ultimately, he had an eternal perspective. No matter what he faced, he knew that one day he would dwell with his God!

"Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." (Psalm 23:6)

"O Lord, you took up my case; you redeemed my life." (Lamentations 3:58)

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'" (Jeremiah 29:11)

WOW! It's so much better to gain our perspective through the eyes of God and what we mean to Him!

Finally, this power-packed verse from Romans 8:28 can get us through many difficult times:

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

God's got this. There is NOTHING we experience where He is not with us. Praise His holy name!

In fact, Romans 8:37 says: "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." I know that makes me feel better and more confident. God's got my back! Instead of being afraid, we can know that God is in everything, and we WIN!

To sum it all up, be careful about the source of your perspectives. Matthew 6:33 (NIV) says: "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."
