Programs, embedded in literacy and numeracy, are developed by the local summer school principal to reflect the local school focus and include: Indigenous Education, Black Excellence in Literacy and Numeracy, Social Justice, STEM, STEAM, Robotics, Music, Drama, Yoga, Robotics, and much more. International Languages - Elementary and African Heritage (ILE-AH) Summer Program

The International Languages - Elementary and African Heritage (ILE-AH) Summer Program begins on July 5 with over 32 languages and African Heritage. African Heritage classes will focus on learning Black culture and contributions of people of African descent. Language classes/activities will be focused on building students' abilities in oral communication, reading and writing. They will also be encouraged to get up, get outside and do hands-on and research-based activities throughout the summer program.

- The number of students enrolled this year is 25% more than last year.
- New languages offered this year: Azerbaijan, Macedonian, Sinhalese, Twi and Tigrinya.

Learn4Life - General Interest Summer Program

There are currently over 600 learners registered for our Learn4Life Summer Program which provides general interest courses for adults aged 18 and older and seniors.
