1. Continuing Education Secondary Credit Summer Programs 2023

Continuing Education In-Person and Remote Secondary Credit Summer programs have **mandatory attendance daily** from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday to Friday.

Incoming TDSB Grade 8 Summer Reach Ahead credit opportunity: TDSB Grade 8 students are eligible to register for the TDSB Continuing Education, In Person or Remote Secondary Full Credit Summer Reach Ahead course, GLD2O1. Students will be at home or in person learning live with their teacher daily from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with lunch from 12:00-12:45 p.m. Attendance is mandatory.

In-Person Full Credit Program: Students can enrol in **one** full-credit course that is offered in **July only**. Students will be in person learning with their teacher daily from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with lunch from 12:00-12:45 p.m. Attendance is mandatory.

Remote Summer Full Credit Program: Students can enrol in **one** full-credit course that is offered in **July only**. **All classes are remote** in the remote learning model. Students will be at home learning live, synchronously with their teacher daily from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m, with lunch from 12:00-12:45 p.m. Attendance is mandatory.

In Person Summer Full Credit Program Adult 18+: Adults can enrol in one full-credit course that is offered in July only at City Adult Learning Centre. All classes are in person. Adults will be in person learning with their teacher daily from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with lunch from 12:00-12:45 p.m. Attendance is mandatory.

Remote Adult 18+ Summer Credit Program: Adults can enrol in **one** full-credit course that is offered in **July only**. **All classes are remote** in the remote learning model. Adults will be at home learning live synchronously with their teacher daily from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m, with lunch from 12:00-12:45 p.m. Attendance is mandatory.

Remote Credit Recovery Credit Program - For TDSB Students ONLY: The Toronto District School Board is offering current TDSB students the opportunity to recover one or two credits for the month of July 2023. Remote Summer Credit Recovery courses are open to current TDSB high school students who have taken the course in the past two years but have not earned the credit. All classes are

remote, there are no in-person classes available. Regular attendance in the remote environment is a requirement. Students may enrol in one course either in the AM or PM, or in two courses, one in the AM and one in the PM. Attendance is mandatory.

Summer Dual Credit, SWAC and Coop Credit Programs: Will be offered during the month of July. Students can register through their day school guidance counsellors.

e-Summer Programs

The e-Learning Department runs two full e-Summer programs in July and August to meet the needs of Ontario secondary school students. Program dates are July 4-28, 2023 and July 31- August 25. Each session runs for 19 days.

TDSB students have priority in course registration. Detailed information and course offerings are outlined on the [e-Learning Summer Programs site](#).

All e-Summer courses are delivered entirely online through Brightspace by teachers who provide their students with a supportive, flexible learning environment. Teachers provide a daily lesson that includes one hour of direct instruction. Attendance is not required at the lesson. Students may attend the lesson as scheduled or access the recording of the lesson which is posted for later viewing. The remainder of the day is asynchronous learning with ongoing teacher support through one-on-one conferencing, email, small group tutorials and material posted in the Brightspace shell.

Students are required to complete and submit assignments according to the due dates listed in the Course Outline or extension dates when pre-arranged with the teacher.

Grade 8 Summer Reach Ahead Opportunity: Current Grade 8 students are eligible to register for the e-Summer Full Credit Summer Reach Ahead course, GLD2OE. Successful completion of this e-Summer course counts towards the mandatory e-Learning diploma requirement.

Grade 9 Credit Opportunity: Current Grade 9 students are eligible to register for the compulsory Grade 10 courses, Civics and/or Career Studies. Each course is worth 0.5 credits credits. Successful

completion of either of these e-Summer courses counts towards the mandatory e-Learning credit requirement.

Grade 10, 11 and 12 Credit Courses: Secondary school students under 21 years of age before July 1 may enrol in a wide range of courses for which they have any required prerequisite. The Grade 11 and 12 courses are offered at Open, College, Mixed, and University levels to provide a variety of student learning opportunities. Successful completion of either of these e-Summer courses counts towards the mandatory e-Learning diploma requirement.

Online Orientation

All e-Summer courses begin with an online orientation with their course teacher prior to the start of the course. Students attend one orientation session on either day scheduled: for July courses, June 26, repeated June 27; for August courses, July 26, repeated July 27.

To enrol in e-Summer courses, students must have any required prerequisite, register through e-Reg, and be approved by their school guidance counsellor.

Credits earned through e-Summer will count towards the two mandatory e-Learning credits required by students who entered Grade 9 in 2020 or later.
