Dear Students:

Tulane University prepares for emergency situations through our Office of Emergency Preparedness & Response. New Orleans is a vibrant city that has much to offer, including inclement weather. As you prepare for the upcoming academic year, be sure that you're ready for everything from heat (bring a reusable water bottle) to severe storms (bring your rain gear – it's smart to always carry an umbrella) to winter weather (you'll need a coat).

**EMERGENCY ALERTS**

Should the need arise for us to send an emergency alert (called TU Alerts), you will receive it via text message, phone call, email, and/or Everbridge app alert. **To receive emergency alerts, all students must:**

- Make sure **your cell phone number** is listed in your student portal in Gibson.

**Download the Everbridge app**

- Available for free in the App Store and Google Play store
- Select Tulane University as your organization and log in using your Tulane credentials.
- Use Everbridge app safety features: Safe Corridor virtual escort, Emergency Call & SOS.

**HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS**

All students are **required** to have a personal evacuation plan that they can implement without university assistance. Develop your plan and input the information in Gibson under **Student Evacuation Plan**. If a major storm is approaching New Orleans, you should feel empowered to implement your personal evacuation plan even if the university has not announced if it will shelter in place or evacuate. Be sure to first communicate your decision with your professors and take everything you will need to attend classes remotely. In some cases, you may choose to evacuate when the university has decided to shelter in place. If you evacuate, you should plan to be gone for at least a week.

Following an emergency, the university will provide updated information, including when you may return to campus, via email, text message, and on the emergency website, **[tulane.edu/emergency](https://tulane.edu/emergency)**. Do not return to campus until the university has communicated that it is safe to do so.
