

RAMS DISTANCE LEARNING PLAN

We know and understand there is a lot of change and uncertainty at this time. Your family's health and well-being is always our priority and we are committed to continuing your child's education while away from school due to COVID-19 (coronavirus). Governor Tim Walz has declared that all schools in Minnesota will begin offering distance learning this coming <u>Monday through at least April 30th</u>. At this time the governor is asking schools to prepare for students returning to school buildings on Tuesday, May 5. Please keep in mind that these plans could change. This message is to provide you with an overview of our distance learning plans.

Why distance learning days?

Our distance learning plan provides students with new learning and sustains previous learning. Our task is to create meaningful experiences related to learning goals and outcomes, aligned with state academic standards. With your help at home, we can make instruction and learning as meaningful as possible.

About distance learning

- Focuses on the most critical learning goals to make learning manageable for everyone.
- It requires less school time than a face-to-face school day.
- Establishes routines and structures that support students and families.
- It provides instruction that meets the needs of all learners to the best extent possible.
- Leverages digital tools that students are already familiar with.

How distance learning days work

Instruction will be delivered through school-issued student iPads using Schoology. Students have used this platform to support learning already and are very familiar with it for instruction and doing schoolwork. Ipads that were restricted will be unrestricted while students are participating in distance learning. Other materials and resources may be used, but students should begin by checking Schoology for each of their classes. Teachers have begun to check in with students via Schoology now. Students are encouraged to login to Schoology now to see direct communication from teachers before instruction begins March 30th.

Assignments and daily communication will be posted on Schoology by 8 a.m. While there are structured times that teachers are available, if students are not available during certain times of the day, they can do their learning at another time. We will be following the same school <u>calendar</u> regarding non-school days (e.g. April 10 is a non-school day).

Distance learning may change over time. We will continue to improve, and we also want to gather feedback from students, families and staff to learn what is working and what is not. We will continue to work closely with students and families to review distance learning and your students' needs.

Staff Connecting with Students

Attendance

Communication

Students and families can contact teachers via Schoology message, email or by leaving a voicemail on the teacher's school phone. Email is the most effective way to communicate with teachers at this time.

Technology

Schoology and Zoom will be the primary platforms for students and teachers. Zoom will be the primary platform for educators to connect in real-time using audio and/or video. Students will receive Zoom guidelines about protecting student's privacy and etiquette.
