Hello, TMI! Father Scott Brown here with your October 9th Community Update, keeping you in the loop on all things TMI. Today's the end of the first quarter. As a quick update on the Walker Innovation Center, I'm actually on the Mims Terrace of the Walker Innovation Center. This beautiful space is just outside of the idea labs. The Walker Innovation Center opens up this week as well. So when students come back to campus after the PSAT, if you have classes in this building – Innovation & Design courses, some of our biology courses and physics courses, and some of our engineering courses – they will all take place in the Walker Innovation Center and we will be open for students just after we get back from the long weekend; hopefully by the end of next week, if not, then by the beginning of the following week. But, this is the end of the first week of having all of our students on campus and it's been very well received. We've done a great job, our teachers are amazing as they continue to work multiple jobs, taking care of the students who are at home and tending to those in their classroom.

All in all, we're really pleased with where we're going. We've got a lot of work ahead of us and we'll keep making TMI the best we can be.
