

# SPLIT



#### **Saturday, 22 Jun 2024**

Croatia's cool and buzzing city of Split is a unique delight. With a lively energy and a wealth of ancient and modern treasures heaped between the low-slung mountains and the jeweled blue sea, Split will split your heart right open. Charter guests should be sure to visit the UNESCO heritage wonder of Diocletian's Palace which has been wooing visitors for over 1700 years. With its roman square, fun bazaar, and romantic passageways scattered with intimate eateries and wine bars, this is Croatia at its atmospheric best. While the old town and surrounding city are studded with temples, churches, and ruins, Split also offers sublime access to its turquoise beaches, especially at Bacvice and the peaceful cove of Kasjuni.

Šibenik is the only major coastal city that was not founded by the Romans, but by the Croats. As one of the oldest native Croatian cities on the Adriatic, it was mentioned for the first time in 1066 in the donation document of King Petar Krešimir IV so it is also called Krešimir's town. It is located around one of the best Adriatic natural harbors and on the slopes of the hills that surround it with several fortresses, in the estuary of the Krka River, which forms the Sibenik Bay.

Entrance to Sibenik by sea is therefore exceptional since it leads through a 2.5 km long channel of St. Ante at the head of which is located the fortress of St. Nicholas (UNESCO World Heritage List).

Skradin is a small town located near the Krka River and at the entrance to the Krka National Park, 17 km away from Šibenik. The main attraction of the park, Slapovi Krke is a series of waterfalls, the biggest of which, Skradinski Buk was named after Skradin.

Vis is the farthest inhabited island off the Croatian mainland. It was known for its fishing industry but present-day industries on the island are agriculture and tourism. Vis was also the military base for many years which makes it an authentic location.

Vis has many small bars and restaurants, with a very chill vibe. Vis is located in a spacious bay, with a lot of waterfronts to walk and explore, surrounded by peaceful woods, perfect for a hike, featuring locations such as Fort George, and other smaller towers, historic Villas, and archeological sites, all in 30 minutes walking distance.

The town of Komiža is located on the southern side of the island; it is possible to organize a visit to Komiža. Blue Cave is a cave located on the eastern side of the island of Biševo. It is a geomorphological monument of nature whose special natural light phenomenon leaves no one indifferent.

Korčula is one of Croatia's most treasured islands. This beautiful island, known by the Ancient Greeks as Black Korcula thanks to its lush forests of Aleppo pine, cypress, and oak trees welcomes its visitors with a colorful cultural heritage and interesting legends.

Stroll the enchanting narrow cobbled streets of the town of Korčula, surrounded by 13th-century walls or enjoy one of the many art exhibitions and summer evening festivals. Korčula is well known for Moreška – a traditional sword dance and drama that was common through the Mediterranean in the 12th and 13th centuries, reaching Korčula in the 16th century from Italy and Dubrovnik.



Delightful Dubrovnik with its golden city walls looks every inch of the fantasy Game of Thrones series setting it is famous for. Walking the city walls is a must to get a feel for the place and to soak up those blue and balmy sea views. Sip a coffee on the pedestrian street of Stradun, see 16th-century paintings from Raphael in the Cathedral, and visit ancient forts and towers.

While in Dubrovnik, you have the opportunity to explore the rich history and architecture of Old Town which is on the UNESCO World Heritage list. The prosperity of the city of Dubrovnik from the earliest times was based on maritime trade. In the Middle Ages, the Republic of Dubrovnik, it was the only city-state on the eastern coast of the Adriatic that competed with the Republic of Venice. It was known for its wealth and diplomacy. Nowadays known as a living monument.
