

**Christine Loh**, *Visiting Professor; Former Government Minister, Hong Kong S.A.R. Government*

Christine Loh served as the undersecretary for the environment in the Hong Kong S.A.R. (HKSAR) Government from 2012 to 2017. Loh's direct policy responsibilities included air quality, energy, climate change and biodiversity. She worked with her Mainland Chinese counterparts to define new policies to control shipping emissions, an area of work she pioneered prior to joining the HKSAR Government, which has changed China's national policy in this area. She created new dialogue platforms between the government and business sectors in order to strengthen Hong Kong's capacity to meet the challenge of climate change. She worked directly to draft a range of key policy documents for the Environment Bureau. She currently serves as chief development strategist at the Institute for the Environment at Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, as well as adjunct professor at the Division of Environment and Sustainability. In the 2018 and 2019 winter quarters, she taught a course at the UCLA Anderson School of Management titled Non-Market Risks and Understanding Politics: The Global Context for Doing Business.
