Steube (R-FL) Cosponsors: 11 Rs	To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security and Secretary of State to require aliens applying for certain visas to disclose if they receive funds from the Government of the People's Republic of China or the Chinese Communist Party, and for other purposes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Requires DHS to update Form I-20 for F and M visas to require submission of whether they have received or plan to receive certain funds from China, CCP, or entity owned or controlled by China, the amount of those funds, and a description of the entity providing funds. - Requires Dept of State to update Form DS-2019 to require the same information of J-1 visa holders. - Those who fail to report funds would have their visa revoked. - Extends disclosure to spouses or minor children if receiving an F, M, or J visa. <p>Last Action: House – 3/5/2021 – Referred to Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.</p>

This prohibition shall not apply in any year in which the Office of the Director of National Intelligence certifies to Congress that China's government has stopped sponsoring, funding, facilitating, and actively working to support efforts to infringe the intellectual property rights of U.S. citizens and companies. <p>Last Action: House – 05/18/2021 – Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.</p>

Good (R-VA) Cosponsors: 12	To direct the Attorney General to report to Congress on how United States taxpayer-funded research has benefitted China, and for other purposes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Requires the Department of Justice to report to Congress on the extent to which China has benefited from U.S. taxpayer-funded research. <p>Last Action: House - 02/11/2021 Referred to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, and in addition to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.</p>
<u>H.R. 1091</u> Protect Our Universities Act Sponsors: Rep. Banks (R-IN)	To create a task force within the Department of Education to address the threat of foreign government influence and threats to academic research integrity on college campuses, and for other purposes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Directs the task force to manage a list of Sensitive Research Projects relative to the Commerce Control List, the U.S. Munitions List, and foundational principles developed for advanced military technologies. - Prohibits technology developed by Huawei, ZTE, Kaspersky, and others, from being used in federally-funded sensitive research projects. <p>Last Action: House – 2/18/2021 – Referred to Committee on Education and Labor, and the Committees on Intelligence (Permanent Select), Armed Services, and Science, Space and Technology.</p>

<u>H.R. 1131</u> China Technology Transfer Control Act Sponsors: Rep. Green (R-TN)	To control the export to the People's Republic of China of certain technology and intellectual property important to the national interest of the United States, and for other purposes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Controls exports of certain national interest technology and intellectual property to China. - Requires the President to control exports to China of any covered technology or intellectual property. The President must sanction (1) a foreign person who sells to China or purchases from China any covered item, and (2) a Chinese person who knowingly uses a covered item provided to them in violation of U.S. export control law. - Requires USTR to identify certain products from China that either receive designated support from the Chinese government or are used by China to violate human rights or religious liberties. <p>Last Action: House – 2/18/2021 – Referred to Committee on Foreign Affairs, and the Committee on Ways and Means.</p>

Murphy (R-NC)</p>	<p>To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to improve protections against foreign influence at institutions of higher education, and for other purposes.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Lowers the reporting threshold to include gifts at \$50,000 for one-time amounts or above \$100,000 if multiple gifts/contracts are made by a foreign source in a calendar year. - Requires all disclosure reports to be made public. ED must make publicly available the information in a database made in the year prior to enactment. Institutions must then proceed to make gift/contract information publicly available on a website of the institution. Cotton (R-AR) Cosponsors: 2 Rs	To secure the research enterprise of the United States from the Chinese Communist Party, and for other purposes.	- Last Action: Senate - 02/24/2021 - Read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.
<u>H.R. 1777</u> Stop Higher Education Espionage and Theft Act of 2021 Sponsors: Rep. Stefanik (R-NY) Cosponsors: 9	To address foreign threats to higher education in the United States.	- Establishes a process for designating (and removing, once identified) foreign actors as foreign intelligence threats to higher education via the FBI if the foreign actor has committed, attempted to commit, or conspired to commit certain actions in connection with an institution of higher education (IHE), such as espionage, misuse of visas, or theft of trade secrets. - Requires schools to disclose to the Department of Education any gift or contract with a foreign intelligence threat, including the fair market value of the gift or contract. Last Action: House – 05/18/2021 – Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.
<u>H.R. 2315</u> Higher Education Transparency Act of 2021 Sponsors: Rep. Gosar (R-AZ) Cosponsors: 4	To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require the disclosure of agreements between institutions of higher education and certain foreign sources, and for other purposes.	- Requires an institution of higher education (IHE) that participates in federal student-aid programs to make available on its website the full content of any agreement between the IHE and a foreign source that provides language and cultural teaching resources and services to its students. Kustoff (R-TN) Cosponsors: 4	To secure the research enterprise of the United States from the Chinese Communist Party, and for other purposes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Prohibits certain Chinese citizens from receiving visas to participate in graduate or post-graduate studies in science, technology, engineering, or math (STEM) - Requires institutions of higher education in the federal Student and Exchange Visitor Program to annually certify that no prohibited Chinese citizens are permitted to participate in the institution's graduate or post-graduate STEM programs. - Requires recipients of federal STEM research grants to certify that the recipient (1) is not a Chinese citizen or a participant in a Chinese government foreign researcher recruitment program (a program that compensates individuals to conduct STEM-related research and development), and (2) will not knowingly use grant funds to employ such an individual. - Mandates that entities that receive certain federal research or education assistance shall not knowingly employ any individual participating in a Chinese government foreign researcher recruitment program. <p>Last Action: House - 04/22/2021 - Referred to the Subcommittee on Research and Technology.</p>

<u>H.R. 4465</u> Federally Funded Research and Technology Development Protection Act Sponsors: Rep. Lynch (D-MA) and Rep. Foxx (R-NC)	To enhance transparency and accountability measures in Federal grantmaking to safeguard federally funded research and technology development, and for other purposes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Expands proposed definition of “malign foreign talent recruitment programs.” - Proposes that OMB oversee agency compliance with the bills’ requirements relating to disclosure and involvement in foreign talent recruitment program activities. <p>Last Action: Senate - 04/22/2021 - Read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations.</p>

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H.R. 5478 Protecting the Integrity of our Biomedical Research Act of 2021 Sponsors: Rep. Bilirakis (R-FL) Cosponsors:	To direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services to require disclosure of participation in foreign talent programs as a condition of receipt of Federal extramural biomedical research.	- Requires the HHS Secretary to mandate disclosure of foreign talent program participation as a condition for federal biomedical research funding. <u>Last Action:</u> House - 10/05/2021 Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce.
H.R. 5626 Securing and Fortifying Everyday (SAFE) Biomedical Research Act Sponsors: Rep. Joyce (R-PA) Cosponsors:	To amend title IV of the Public Health Service Act to require the Secretary of Health and Human Services, acting through the Director of the National Institutes of Health, to consult with certain heads of Federal agencies with respect to biomedical research that may affect national security, and for other purposes.	- Requires the HHS Secretary to regularly consult with the heads of the DNI and FBI, as well as other relevant security agencies, on biomedical research conducted by the NHI that may affect or be affected by national security issues. <u>Last Action:</u> House - 10/19/2021 Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce.
H.R. 6305 Protect America's Biomedical Research Enterprise Act of 202 Sponsors: Rep. Cotton (R-AR) Cosponsors: 5 Rs	To prohibit the Secretary of State from issuing B1 and B2 visas to nationals of the People's Republic of China for periods of more than one year unless certain conditions are met.	- Last Action: Senate – 8/3/2021 – Referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, Pensions
<u>S. 568</u> Entity List Verification Act Sponsors: Sen. Scott (R-FL) Cosponsors: 3	A bill to require the Secretary of Commerce to certify, before removing an entity from the entity list, that the entity is no longer involved in activities contrary to the national security or foreign policy interests of the United States and that removing the entity from the list does not pose a threat to allies of the United States.	- Prohibits the Department of Commerce from removing an entity from the entity list until Commerce makes certain certifications. The entity list provides the names of foreign entities who are subject to specific license requirements for the export, reexport, or transfer of specified items. - Establishes that Commerce may not remove an entity from the entity list until Commerce certifies that (1) the entity is no longer involved in activities that are contrary to U.S. national security or foreign policy interests, and (2) removing the entity from the list does not pose a threat to U.S. allies. Wilson (R-SC)	To amend the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938 to limit the exemption from the registration requirements of such Act for persons engaging in activities in furtherance of bona fide religious, scholastic, academic, or scientific pursuits or the fine arts to activities which do not promote the political agenda of a foreign government, to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to clarify the disclosures of foreign gifts by institutions, and for other purposes.	- Limits the academic exemption from the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938 (FARA). - Amends HEA Section 117 to lower the reporting threshold from \$250,000 to \$50,000. Warner (D-VA)</p> <p>Cosponsors: 7</p>	<p>A bill to authorize the establishment of a Technology Partnership among democratic countries, and for other purposes.</p>	<p>- Establishes the International Technology Partnership Office, led by the Special Ambassador for Technology, in the Department of State. The office shall advance U.S. technology policy through the creation of an International Technology Partnership with specified foreign countries. Specifically, the office must create a partnership of democratic countries to develop technology governance regimes, with a focus on key technologies such as artificial intelligence and machine learning, 5G telecommunications, semiconductor chip manufacturing, biotechnology, and quantum computing.
