WRITER. SOCIOLOGIST. POET. PROFESSOR.



Dr. Eve L. Ewing is a Chicago-based sociologist of education. She is the award-winning author of four books, including the forthcoming book for young readers "Maya and the Robot"; the poetry collection "1919," the nonfiction work "Ghosts in the Schoolyard: Racism and School Closings on Chicago's South Side," and her first book, the poetry collection "Electric Arches," which was named one of the year's best books by NPR and the Chicago Tribune. She is the co-author (with Nate Marshall) of the play "No Blue Memories: The Life of Gwendolyn Brooks." She also wrote the "Ironheart" series and the "Champions" series for Marvel Comics. Ewing is an assistant professor at the University of Chicago School of Social Service Administration.
