What is digital storytelling?

Digital storytelling is a form of narrative expression that uses digital media, such as images, videos, audio, and interactive elements, to convey a story or message. 
Storytelling can be used in both teaching and learning contexts.

The Digital Storytelling Process



In <u>8 Steps to Great Digital Storytelling</u>, Samantha Morra provides an excellent overview of the digital storytelling process, as shown in the following graphic.

Writing the script first allows the students to spend more time on storytelling instead of focusing on finding images to illustrate the story. It will enable students to take ownership of the story through the personal nature of their writing.

Using a rubric for digital storytelling projects can promote fairness, consistency, and transparency in the assessment process while providing students with specific feedback on how to improve their work.


This rubric is an example that you may find helpful in evaluating your students' work.

Adobe Express Video is known for its user-friendly interface and easy-to-use templates, making it accessible to those with little or no design experience. It is available as a web application and mobile app for iOS devices.


To access your Adobe account:

- Go to https://www.adobe.com/express
- Sign In
- Click on *I'm a teacher* option
- Select I already have access and click Sign in with school email
- Type in your MC email address (If your first time, create an account)>Continue
- Select Company or School Account>Authenticate login using your MC credentials




To begin working with Adobe Express Video:


• Click the (+) sign at the top of the page to create a new project




• Select Video from the list
