Sukkot is one of three pilgrimage festivals of the Jewish calendar, when ancient Israelites brought sacrifices to the Temple in Jerusalem.

It commemorates the biblical tale of how Hebrews, liberated from Egyptian bondage, wandered in the wilderness for forty years before entering the promise land of Canaan.

During Sukkot, Jews eat and celebrate in a temporary dwelling called a *sukkah*. They offer prayers of thanks, while shaking a *lulav* and *etrog*, a palm frond bound with myrtle and willow, and lemon-like fruit.
