

This means all the final nominees will be present when the award recipient is announced. **FINALIZING THE AWARD** Members of our Class contributed over \$100K to establish this award which provides for an annual \$4,000 check along with a physical memento of the award. For the first award, Jeff Mason donated his personal miniature replica of the E. King Gill Statue (our first Class gift). Interestingly, his casting was number "12" of the miniature castings that were sold to fund the purchase of the E. King Gill

Statue. The committee is currently investigating cost to provide a similar replica annually as the memento to be given in addition to the monetary award. Watch

HISTORY The Class of '80 has a rich history in the area of selfless service. The following steps led to what has become the first award recognizing one of the six Texas A&M University core values. First Class Gift – 12th Man Statue of E. King Gill During our sophomore year of 1977-78, the idea for our first class gift (12th Man Statue) was presented in a Class Council meeting by Marjorie Nicholson of Squadron 14.

A small crowd of dedicated Aggies braved the cold winds to attend the unveiling of the statue




Doug Vorpahl's family were close friends with E. King Gill. Doug's father was the administrator of E. King Gill's estate upon Gill's passing. Below is a 1958






Howdy!
