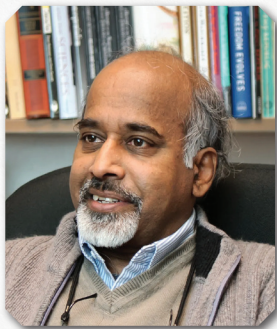


# 100th ANNIVERSARY **SCOPES** **TRIAL** JULY 10 TO JULY 21, 1925 DAYTON, TENNESSEE

## **A Philosophical Reckoning with Darwin's Legacy**

This presentation explores the philosophical, moral, and social fallout of Darwin's theory of evolution (of natural selection). It will examine how the theory radically reshaped the understanding of human nature, challenging human exceptionalism. The talk delves into evolutionary ethics—the idea that moral behavior is adaptive—and addresses the ongoing societal tension between science and faith. It will conclude by discussing the dangers of misinterpreting theory for harmful social policies like eugenics and its enduring relevance.
