Ideas to get you started

- INCLUSION BANNER: Encourage everyone in the school to sign the Choose to Include Inclusion Banner. Get with the Librarian to locate the banner. Take photos of the student and their friends signing the banner. Include those with and without intellectual disabilities. Use the following hashtag when posting #RPSchooseToInclude #YourSchoolName. Get the art teach and classes involved color the school's mascot or image to decorate the banner. Be creative!
- BLACK OUT FRIDAY: Everyone in the school wears black to show that everyone CHOOSES
 TO INCLUDE. Take PICs with the Inclusion banner wearing your black. Include those with and
 without intellectual disabilities. Use the following hashtag when posting

- INCLUSION DANCE PARTY/SING ALONG: Students can sing/dance together to the song "Have It All" by Jason Mraz. Be sure to include those with and without intellectual disabilities. Use the following hashtag when posting any pictures or videos. #RPSchooseToInclude #YourSchoolName
- BOOKS MONDAY THURSDAY: The Librarians at your school have the below books to read
 during your library time. On the days you don't go to the library, watch the below video of

 For the Monday Thursday videos, the teachers can ask the discussion questions under each
 video to engage the students more. If questions need to be modified or changed for those in

Monday - Lesson 1

Can I Join Your Club?

Duck really wants to join a club – any club. Even though he tries hard to fit in, it just doesn't work: he can't roar like Lion or trumpet like Elephant. So, Duck decides to start his own club, with his own rule – Everyone is Welcome!

Tuesday - Lesson 2

Sky Color is a book about looking at things from a different point of view. After observing the world carefully, Marisol is inspired to expand her thinking about the color of the sky.

Confessions of a Bully
