AJ King lives in Washington, DC and has worked over a decade in managing and developing programs focusing on sexual health advocacy (HIV/STI and pregnancy prevention, treatment, and education), clinical mental health, racial equity, and youth populations. He most recently held the position of Director of POWER at Sasha Bruce Youth Work. With a passion for LGBTQ youth of color, AJ has worked to fight stigma, disparities, and injustices within this population. He also contracts with George Washington School of Public Health as a clinical researcher focusing on biomedical interventions and research for PrEP, hookworms, and COVID-19 vaccinations. Currently AJ is the Associate Director of the Multicultural Student LGBTQ Resource Center at the George Washington University.

AJ also has independent projects focusing on substance abuse, HIV, and mental health in the community. He serves as Vice President of Impulse Group DC, a global HIV advocacy organization for gay men funded by AIDS Healthcare Foundation (AHF). He is also the founder and director of the 2015 Obama White House award winning theatre program Breaking Ground. Breaking Ground is a unique theatre program for LGBTQ+ youth of color that develops a full-length musical theatre production based on the true life stories of the cast members, addressing the unique and complex experiences of this population.

AJ graduated from University of the District of Columbia with his Masters in Clinical Mental Health and Rehabilitation Counseling, and his Bachelors in Social Work.
