

Jewish Student Voter Engagement (JSVE) Campus Fellowship Program

The Jewish Electorate Institute (JEI) is recruiting college students for the Jewish Student Voter Engagement Fellowship, which will start in January 2022 and will go through November 2022. Fellows will work both virtually and in-person on their own campuses and will participate in a multi-institutional learning community with fellows from other campuses.

- JEI is an independent, non-partisan organization dedicated to deepening the public's understanding of Jewish American participation in our democracy.
- The JSVE Campus Fellowship is focused on establishing sustainable structures for voter education, registration, and mobilization efforts within the student community.

Our fellows will be tasked with engaging students in voter education and registration efforts in advance of the midterm elections, as well as encouraging participation in civic engagement opportunities on campus.

Structure:

JEI will recruit two students per campus from four universities with large Jewish student populations. Two students will be selected from each campus. Each fellow will be paid a stipend of \$1,000 for their participation in the fellowship and will receive training and guidance from our partners at Tufts University's Institute for Democracy and Higher Education (IDHE).

The pair of fellows from each campus will meet with a campus staff or faculty member, on a regular basis to check-in on their progress, and all fellows will meet with JEI & Tufts staff monthly as a group to receive training and learn best practices from one another.

Objectives:

The purpose of the collaboration between JEI and IDHE is to offer students both the data and practice-oriented tools needed to build a positive campus climate for political and civic engagement on college campuses. Throughout the school year, fellows will focus on voter education, voter registration, and civic engagement efforts.

Qualifications:

- Ability to work independently to implement the program's goals.
- Actively involved in campus, communal, or political organizations.
- Strong communication and collaboration skills.
- Passionate about increasing civic engagement and involvement in our democratic process.
- Experience working with Jewish organizations on campus or nationally.
