

U.S. Navy Band Brass Quintet featured in free concert at SOU

(Ashland, OR). The Oregon Center for the Arts at Southern Oregon University will host the U.S. Navy Band Brass Quintet on Wednesday, June 12. The concert will be free and open to the public at the Southern Oregon University Music Recital Hall in Ashland.

Doors open at 7 p.m., for the 7:30 p.m. concert with free parking in Lot #36 on South Mountain Avenue. The brass quintet provides musical support for official U.S. government ceremonies, a wide variety of public performances, and educational outreach. They perform a variety of styles, from classical to traditional American music, and can entertain audiences of all ages.

The program will open with the lively "Bombasto" by O.R. Farrar, followed by a performance of the traditional arrangement of "Shenandoah" then J.A. Ryther Suite from the "Monteregian Hills" by Morley Calvert, "That's a Plenty" by Lew Pollack, and "Aces of the Air" by Karl L. King.

After intermission the band with return with a rousing, "Star Trek/Throne Room" by Giacchino and Courage/Williams, "Valley Views" by Cait Nishimura, "Do Nothin' Till You Hear From Me" by Duke Ellington, "Manhattan Beach March" by John Philip Sousa, and the program will wrap up with "Libertango" by Astor Piazzolla.

Members of this ensemble include: Musician First Class Steven Hooper on trombone, Musician Second Class Carrie Blosser on trumpet, Musician Third Class Erik Horn on trumpet, Musician Third Class Scott Ullman on French horn, and Musician Third Class Serena Smith on tuba.
