The Governor's Hispanic Fellows Program is an 8 weeks summer program geared towards leadership and professional development, which has offered quality internship experiences to Hispanic college students since 1988. Our students work in a government, corporate or non-profit setting and participate in leadership training seminars conducted by a team comprised of the Center's staff, government officials, business professionals and current and or former elected officials who are each expert in their respective fields. In addition, you will gain the knowledge and understanding of government and corporate culture, networking, and public policy engagement.

Application Guidelines

- Faxed applications are **not** accepted.
- Deadline to apply is Friday, December 16, 2022
- It is the applicant's responsibility to notify the New Jersey Center for Hispanic Policy, Research and Development (CHPRD) of permanent address, email address or phone number changes during the interview, selection and notification process.
- Applicants taking academic courses during normal business days from June 5, 2023 through July 28, 2023, will not be considered.
- Applicants planning vacation or leave time between June 5, 2023 through July 28, 2023, will not be considered.
- Candidates seeking credit for his/her participation must arrange with the College/University's cooperative education or internship department.
- All sections must be completely filled out.

Program Requirements

- Resident of New Jersey
- Of Hispanic descent
- Enrolled in a 2- or 4-year college/university program
- U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident

All applicants are required to submit the following:

- Copy of a clear Photo I.D.
- Personal Statement
 - Use separate sheet.
 - It must be no more than 300 words, typed, font 12, double-spaced and make use of MLA guidelines.
- One Letter of Recommendation
- Official transcript
- Essay Question
 - Respond to the essay question using a separate sheet.
 - It must be no more than 700 words, typed, font 12, double-spaced and make use of MLA guidelines.
- Resume must include:
 - Employment history
 - Community service experience
 - Honors or awards
 - Computer skills
 - Extracurricular activities

The 2023 Governor's Hispanic Fellows Program will begin on June 5, 2023 and end on July 28, 2023.

- Throughout the eight weeks, interns will report to their job placement site Mondays, Tuesday, and Wednesday.
- If invited, an interview will be scheduled with the Center for Hispanic Policy, Research and Development. You will be notified of the outcome of the selection process and may be required to undergo a background check.
- On Thursday and Friday, interns are required to attend the Leadership Workshop Series of the Fellows Program. Attendance is mandatory.
- Students must work no more than 21 hours weekly at their intern placement site and attend weekly training sessions that are 7 hours in duration each. <u>Vacation time is not allowed during the eight weeks</u>.
- Students seeking credit for their internship must abide by their College/University's work hours requirement (please make sure you inform the Center).
- All interns selected **must** complete all institute assignments and projects, which include completion of <u>Professional Team presentation.</u>
