 - a spiritual formation group (Bible study, book/video study, prayer, or service group)
 - o a group focused on integrating Christian faith, thought, and practice with a specific area of study at Emory (PhD, Medical/Nursing, Rollins, law, business, theology, etc.)
 - o an investigative Bible study or book study that actively invites non-Christians and tailors discussions to their concerns.
- Event Coordinator: Organize social, service, outreach and/or worship gatherings where people:
 - have fun and build solid friendships,
 - o hear and understand the Christian gospel
 - o grow in attentiveness to God's leading in their lives as followers of Jesus in grad school
 - o (could include First Friday Dinners, Veritas, service, worship, or school-focused events).

Connections Coordinator

- Coordinate beginning-of-the-semester follow up with new and returning students who are not yet regularly involved in the fellowship
- o Implement a "buddy" program to connect students within their areas of study
- Stay aware of who is not consistently participating in the fellowship and help people find a home in GCF
