

Thank you for your interest in the JROTC Scholarship awarded by the District of Columbia State Society Daughters of the American Revolution. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who has been a member of a JROTC program for at least one year in their sophomore, junior, or senior year, and is planning to pursue a degree at an accredited trade school, college, or university.

Scholarship Overview:

- \$2,500 one-time scholarship for the first year, and
- Possibility to apply for up to \$1,000 annual renewal scholarship for three additional years.

The application for this scholarship includes the following elements:

- Application
- Three Short Essays (See Application)
- Recommendation Form completed by JROTC Officer
- Recommendation Form completed by a teacher or counselor
- Official copy of transcript
- Photocopy of United States citizenship: birth certificate, naturalization papers, or information page of U.S. Passport. *Note: Cover your photo if you are submitting a copy of naturalization or passport pages*.

Interested applicants should email the completed application form, essays, and official copy of transcript to the chairman of the DCDAR Scholarship Committee in one email no later than **April 15 Midnight EST**. The completed recommendation forms should be emailed to the chairman of the DCDAR Scholarship Committee directly from the recommender no later than **April 15 Midnight EST**. All documents should be emailed to <u>scholarship.dar@gmail.com</u>.

Incomplete applications will be not be considered. Photographs will result in disqualification and should not be included. Scholarships are judged and awarded without regard to gender, race, color, religion, national origin or disability. All applicants must be a United States citizen and a resident of the District of Columbia who is planning on attending an accredited trade school, college, or university in the United States.

The scholarship winner will be notified by email no later than the second week of May. The winner will be required to submit to the state chairman their social security number and the complete address and contact information for the trade school, college, or university they will be attending. Funds will be transferred directly to the institution they will be attending in the recipient's name. Scholarship must be used within one year of date of award, or it is forfeited.


