Apprenticeship Across TBR

Double Digit Growth

26% growth in first time apprentices in 22-23.

Offered at a Majority of Colleges

Apprenticeships were offered at 17 of our 37 colleges in 22-23.

Northeast State and Eastman Chemical Lead the Pack

NESCC held the largest apprenticeship serving 258 Eastman employees in 22-23.

13 Colleges Started or Expanded Apprenticeship

8 community colleges and 5 technical colleges started a new apprenticeship in 22-23.

Funding Secured to Grow Apprenticeship

\$2,500,000 in funding across the last 3 years.

New Apprenticeships

Collaborating with the Tennessee Forestry Association, UT's Grow Your Own Center, and the Floor Covering Education Foundation to build new apprenticeships.
