

Executive Summary of Changes for “GLI-33 Standards for Event Wagering Systems V1.1”, Issued May 14, 2019

Below is an Executive Summary of the changes in the “GLI-33 V1.1, Standards for Event Wagering Systems”:

- Updated layout and formatting of the document to provide a modern feel to the standard.
- Reorganized and restructured document into more consumable chapters and sections, providing better distinction between technical requirements, which can be evaluated in the lab, and operational controls and procedures, which can be evaluated on-site.
- Updated Glossary of Key Terms.
- Incorporated limited alignment with widely-accepted jurisdictional and international standards.
- Added appendices pertaining to Operational Audits for Event Wagering Procedures and Practices, as well as Technical Security Controls in order to further help regulators and operators create more efficient and alternative processes to monitor wagering operations.
- Removed chapter for Self-Service Wagering Devices and provided pointer to GLI-20, as the functionality of these devices are often incorporated with kiosks.
- Removed chapter for Remote Wagering Devices, incorporating sections into the chapters pertaining to the System Requirements and the Wagering Device Requirements based on responsibility of the requirement.
- Removed chapter for Player Account Requirements, incorporating sections into the chapter pertaining to the System Requirements and the appendix for Operational Audit for Event Wagering Procedures and Practices based on content of the requirement.
- Transformed chapter for System Security Requirements into an appendix for Operational Audit for Technical Security Controls.
- Added various notes to improve clarity of requirements, and to better document known conditions or restrictions.
- Made various grammatical changes throughout the document to improve clarity and readability.
