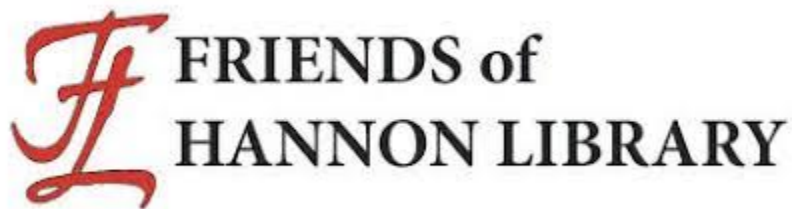


March Panel Asks What Are You Reading
