## A NOTE ABOUT 2020

The year 2020 has been like no other in recent memory, indelibly affecting this year's graduating class. In January, the world became aware of a new virus causing serious illnesses, and, in two short months, the novel coronavirus COVID-19 was declared a global pandemic by the World Health Organization. In an unprecedented effort to limit the spread of the virus, protect the most vulnerable populations, and minimize the burden on our hospitals and health systems, Ohio Governor Mike DeWine issued a stay-at-home order for the state in March. The order required Ohio citizens to stay in their homes, except for activities deemed essential, and all non-essential business activity also ceased. While the governor's order designated educational institutions as essential businesses, it urged them to limit operations on-campus to only those that were in service of remote learning, critical research, and essential functions. As the world struggled to understand and respond to an entirely new viral infection extending around the globe, Denison first announced a move to temporary remote learning on March 10, transitioning by March 16 to a decision to enact entirely remote learning for the remainder of the spring 2020 semester. This disruption of the academic year was felt most keenly by this year's senior class.

During the pandemic period, the State of Ohio has been consistent in a clear call for large assemblies to be canceled and for all communication to be kept as "virtual" as possible. At least through the end of May 2020, public and communal gatherings, such as commencements, are prohibited. For these reasons, with deep regrets, Denison decided that an in-person Commencement event on May 16, 2020, was not possible. The Denison community grieves the loss of our yearly celebration inviting parents, grandparents, families, and friends to assemble with their graduates on this day. Nonetheless, we gather at a distance to commemorate the achievements of the talented, dedicated, cohesive, and resilient Class of 2020 in this Conferral of Degrees virtual ceremony. With this ceremony, we honor and appreciate our graduating seniors and those who have reason to congratulate them at this important moment in their lives. When it is safe to assemble again, we are resolved to celebrate the class of 2020 with great joy and pride.

# RETIRING VICE PRESIDENT

JULIA B. HOUPPT '75

B.A., DENISON UNIVERSITY; J.D. UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA  
VICE PRESIDENT EMERITA OF INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT

Julie Houpt '75 returned to Denison in 2001 as vice president for University Resources and Public Affairs, now Institutional Advancement. Under her leadership, on June 30, 2008, Denison successfully concluded its most ambitious fundraising campaign to that date, Higher Ground: The Campaign for Denison, having exceeded its \$160 million goal by more than \$15 million. With that campaign celebration wrapped up, as leader of the advancement team, she took charge of assembling a new challenge, Unlocking Potential: Investing in Denison, which set a goal of \$225 million, and whose conclusion on June 30, 2020, undoubtedly will set another new record for Denison University.

Before becoming a vice president at Denison, Houpt was an active volunteer for the college for many years, serving as a career advisor, a club president, an Annual Fund volunteer, and a volunteer in The Campaign for Denison from 1989 to 1994. She also was a member of Alumni Council from 1995 to 1997, and again in 2000 and 2001 when she served as its president. Her professional career after graduating from Denison took her from graduate work at the University of Minnesota to a law degree from the University of Southern California. After several years in the practice of law, she joined the major gift fundraising team at Stanford University in Palo Alto, continuing to develop those skills as director of major gifts at the University of Pennsylvania and director of development at Friends' Central School, both in Philadelphia.

In the unique position of being an alumna and a member of the senior staff at Denison, Houpt has had the opportunity to witness close-up the entire transformative arc of the institution. In her own words, "I believe strongly in the power of education to change lives; and I believe strongly in the power of a liberal arts education and, specifically, a Denison education, to change lives. Now, more than ever, as we send a new generation of young people into the world, the ability to think, to listen, to understand and empathize, to communicate, to create, to persuade, and to lead will be critical to solving global challenges. I'm proud to have played some small part in making a Denison education accessible to the talented young people who come to this college."

Houpt is a member of the Council for Advancement & Support of Education (CASE). She has served as a faculty member for CASE conferences and institutes and, in 2008, was appointed to the CASE Commission on Philanthropy.

Julie and her husband, John Kralovec, reside in Granville and have two sons. Julie and John had planned a great deal of travel, including a trip to Machu Picchu this summer, which is now on hold. They will be keeping their home base in Granville and continuing work with local organizations like the Boys and Girls Club of Newark, and volunteering for her beloved alma mater.

# RETIRING VICE PRESIDENT

LAUREL B. KENNEDY

B.A., UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN; M.A., PH.D., OHIO UNIVERSITY

PROFESSOR EMERITA OF COMMUNICATION, VICE PRESIDENT EMERITA FOR STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

Laurel Kennedy became vice president for student development in 2010. Her 30-year career at Denison includes service as a professor in the Communication Department and as department chair from 1996 to 2002; dean of first-year students from 2002 to 2007; and director of the John W. Alford Center for Service Learning from 2007 to 2010. The common thread running through all of these roles has been her commitment to supporting students as they pursue the knowledge and skills that will help them live meaningful lives and become capable contributors in their communities and careers.

Born in Minneapolis, Kennedy earned a B.A. in communication arts from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and an M.A. in telecommunications from Ohio University. She worked for three years at National Public Radio before returning to Ohio University to pursue a Ph.D. in international communication. She received a Fulbright for her dissertation research in Malaysia and subsequent grants for study in Viet Nam. She joined Denison's Department of Communication in 1990 and was tenured and promoted to associate professor in 1996. She taught courses on research methods, broadcasting history, and the political economy of United States and international media. Her teaching often integrated community service-learning, including a first-year seminar in which students built a Habitat for Humanity house. Kennedy has published scholarly work in her academic field of international communication, and she has presented often in the field of student development on assessment, student retention, and student well-being.

Kennedy's administrative leadership has been marked by efforts to give students voice. As dean of first-year students, she established annual themes and invited entering students to introduce themselves to Denison through creative projects, which were anthologized. As vice president, she developed a program of research and outcomes assessment that shaped divisional initiatives, especially related to student health and welfare. Those efforts led to the creation of the Red Thread Grant, career development initiatives for economically vulnerable students, the development of wellness initiatives serving the distinct needs of different student populations, and the formation of RED Corps to bring student perspectives to the college's \$57 million Housing Master Plan and the design of an innovative, integrative wellness center. Her development of crisis management protocols provided direction in critical moments, and her time as vice president has been highlighted by the development of exceptionally strong teams within the Student Development division. She describes supporting the professional aspirations of her staff as a source of particular pleasure.

Laurel and her husband, Rick Courson, retreat when they can to a log cabin they built on a remote lake in northern Ontario. In retirement, they plan to embark on a tour of adventurous travel across the United States and Canada, with stops to visit Joe and Mary, Laurel's son and daughter, and the gaggle of Denison students who took up residency in their home over the years as extended family.

# RETIRING FACULTY

JOHN E. CORT

B.A., M.A., UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN; A.M., PH.D., HARVARD UNIVERSITY  
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF RELIGION

When he arrived at Denison in 1992, John Cort hit the ground running. Carving out space and creating value for a multifaceted understanding of religion, he immediately began to broaden the Department of Religion's offerings through interdisciplinary inclinations and a global orientation. Since then, he has continued to appreciate the opportunities he has been afforded to create space for academic activism at Denison that involves both students and faculty peers.

John Cort has taught courses on art, environmentalism, human rights, and the religions of Asia. His research focuses on the Jain traditions of South Asia, as well as religion, society, culture and history in Western India. Serving on several interdisciplinary academic committees at Denison (East Asian Studies, Environmental Studies, and International Studies), Cort has twice served as Director of the International Studies Program and was named the Judy Gentili Chair of International Studies in 2017. Many of his courses are cross listed under programs that draw students from across campus.

In the classroom, Cort is similarly open-minded. "I like to pull the rug out from under people, get them thinking in new ways," he reflected, describing religion more as a

field of study than a discipline. His teachings are brought to life by visual material and textual translation methods akin to those of art historians, and contextualized through immersive life experience.

After receiving an undergraduate degree in South Asian Studies from the University of Wisconsin, John Cort later went on to pursue a Ph.D. in the Study of Religion at Harvard. For several years before pursuing entering graduate school he worked as a community organizer, and spent time in India supervising an undergraduate study abroad program. He has returned to India many times over the years to conduct anthropological field work. Inspired by an appreciation for those who have done social justice work in a variety of cases, Cort has aimed to show students how to confront religion where it meets them, welcoming intercultural learning in his approach.

In retirement, John Cort looks forward to the ability to shape his time around a variety of research and writing projects and eventually travel. He will most miss the simple satisfaction of what happens in the classroom when it's going well, and the meaningful connections derived from his students and scholarly engagements.

# RETIRING FACULTY

MICHAEL M. FUSON

B.A., HAVERFORD COLLEGE; M.S., PH.D., YALE UNIVERSITY  
ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF CHEMISTRY & BIOCHEMISTRY

It was the opportunity to have a career working with college students as a teacher while engaging in scholarly research at a significant level that brought Michael Fuson to Denison in 1989, and the interplay of those two realms defined much of his experience here. Thirty-one years as a faculty member in Denison's Department of Chemistry & Biochemistry demonstrates his commitment to interactive learning and face-to-face, handcrafted instruction.

With a father who taught at Earlham College and earning his own undergraduate degree at Haverford College, Fuson's understanding of the liberal arts model for higher education became instinctive and enduring. Self-described as a physical chemist, further study in the areas of chemistry that extended into physics while pursuing his Ph.D. at Yale led to research interests in molecular motion. At Denison, Fuson continued to explore molecules that have considerable internal flexibility and are constantly changing shape.

Dr. Fuson taught a wide range of courses throughout his academic career, describing working with students "who are first encountering science at a serious level" with great joy. And in advanced courses, he enjoyed sharing his unique research with students and hearing their reflections about the scientific discovery they were experiencing first-hand.

With dozens of directed study, summer, and senior research students over the years, collaborative exploration was another important feature of Fuson's time at Denison.

He finished his Denison career as chair of the Department Chemistry & Biochemistry, a position he first held some two decades earlier. Additionally, he served Denison as chair of the faculty and was indispensable in the college's successful application for a grant from the Howard Hughes Medical Institute. Focused on improving undergraduate education in biology and chemistry, the grant netted funding for equipment, faculty development, new resources for courses, and support of student research. As director of Denison's Undergraduate Biological Sciences Education Program from 2000 to 2006, Fuson speaks with pride about how the HHMI funding increased and enhanced the department's offerings for both faculty and students.

Among the things that Mike will miss most in retirement are the daily exploration that his students experience in classrooms and labs and the opportunity to share with them the things that excite him about thinking like a scientist. When possible, he anticipates a fair amount of traveling, but he equally enjoys time spent gardening and caring for his century-old home in Granville.

# RETIRING FACULTY

SANDRA K. MATHERN-SMITH

B.A., PORTLAND STATE UNIVERSITY; M.F.A., UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN  
PROFESSOR EMERITA OF DANCE

“I was always a mover as a young person,” Sandra Mathern-Smith remembers as she spent her formative years in constant motion. From early training with a local modern dance company in her hometown of Salem, Ore., she went on to study dance at Portland State University, where she discovered experimental and contemporary styles of movement she felt were intellectually and physically engaging. A master of fine arts degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison provided the opportunity for more advanced exploration, leading to further interest in collaboration, experimentation, and improvisation.

In 1988, after the completion of her graduate studies, and time spent in New York, Mathern-Smith came to Denison on a temporary teaching contract with few possessions and little expectation of staying. As she worked within the Department of Dance year after year, her dynamic presence at Denison — and throughout the region — extended into a passionate and distinguished career as an artist, innovator, and mentor. For her work in dance and movement, Mathern-Smith has earned a Fulbright Scholar Award, an Individual Excellence Award in Choreography from the Ohio Arts Council, twice received Ohio Individual Artist Fellowships in Choreography, and was awarded over 30 grants for choreographic research and production, among additional accolades.

When she arrived at Denison, the emphasis in the department was centered around modern dance and jazz. As a professor and eventual chair of the program, Mathern-Smith introduced experimental and improvisational styles

to the course offerings, introducing to students, many for the first time, to post-modern dance, through her grounded, articulate, fluid, and often athletic contemporary dance technique, solo, duet, and group improvisation, performances in traditional and non-traditional spaces, choreography, and production. Contemporary technique melded with a highly collaborative approach to teaching and learning, and working organically gave way to interdisciplinary experimentation, improvisation, and collaboration. Performances with visiting artists such as the New York-based string quartet ETHEL drew students from across campus, and her choreography of 43 original works for students frequently featured musicians and visual artists from within the Denison cultural community and beyond.

Mathern-Smith also has explored the use of technology in dance, a natural complement to the interactive nature of her work. She established global connections through seminars that took students and faculty to Sri Lanka, fostered by her role as an undergraduate mentor to an alumna of the Denison dance program. Returning to Sri Lanka several times since 2016, collaboration and improvisation have remained distinguishing characteristics of Mathern-Smith’s personal exploration and professional career.

In retirement, Sandy relishes the absence of great plans! She looks forward to traveling, relaxing, and connecting with family and, of course, dancing — wherever and whenever it happens next.



# RETIRING FACULTY

TIMOTHY I. MILLER

B.S., OKLAHOMA COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS; M.S., PH.D., SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY  
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF ECONOMICS

Tim Miller's scholarly career began as a double major in the areas of mathematics and economics at the Oklahoma College of Liberal Arts, where he graduated with highest honors. He continued his education at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, where he earned his M.S. and Ph.D. He went on to take additional advanced training at the University of Rochester.

As a professor in the Department of Economics who also taught courses in the politics, philosophy and economics major, Miller has instructed students in macroeconomics and personal finance. His classes have ranged from introductory surveys to senior-level research in econometrics, consumer economics, and mathematical macroeconomics.

In 1978, Professor Miller came to Denison from the College of Wooster where he taught economics. Since that time,

his presence at Denison has afforded opportunities for students to explore current and historic economic events in a more personal context. His research focuses on the application of geographical information technology and spatial econometrics to current social issues, which he has examined contextually.

Highlights of Dr. Miller's extensive scholarship include published research on regional residential foreclosures and funding gaps in Ohio's public schools. He also served Denison by mediating the college's political film series sponsored annually by the Department of Economics.

In 2014, Tim was recognized by Denison for his achievement as the college's J.P. Morgan Chase Endowed Professor. He retires from Denison after 42 years on the faculty.

# RETIRING FACULTY

DAVID P.J. PRZYBYLA

B.A., SUNY COLLEGE AT FREDONIA; M.S., PURDUE UNIVERSITY; PH.D., SUNY AT ALBANY  
ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF PSYCHOLOGY

Since arriving at Denison in 1985, David Przybyla's presence in Denison's Department of Psychology has afforded students a dynamic exploration of organizational studies. His teaching academic of concepts with a practical perspective often created unique and mutually beneficial opportunities to bring classwork to life both on and beyond the campus, such as a course that prompted student consideration of ways to draw the Denison community to the downtown area of nearby Newark.

As director of the Organizational Studies program at Denison for 22 years, Dr. Przybyla has led students in consulting projects for local, regional, and national organizations, developing the ability to examine problems with both a critical and creative eye. Under his guidance, students have learned to synthesize and articulate solutions in multiple settings, developing crucial skills in negotiation, teamwork, and leadership in the process.

Students in Org Studies explore the theoretical framework behind institutional participation, authority models, and interpersonal behavior. They attend a four-week summer session offered each year after the end of the spring semester. Traveling to various cities of interest, they learn about leadership styles and organizational structure through connections with professional mentors and hands-

on experience. Not coincidentally, those mentors often are Denison grads and sometimes former Org Studies students. Przybyla's shaping of this signature program stems from the breadth of his own academic experience.

Educated at SUNY College at Fredonia, Purdue University, and SUNY at Albany, his research has ranged from gender and sexuality — such as the morphological characteristics and their consequences in the area of interpersonal attraction — to gender differences in the use of power in hierarchical and collaborative organizational cultures.

A 35-year member of Denison's faculty, Dave's teaching of organizational psychology has asked students to consider a broad spectrum of theoretical and real-world issues affecting human groups and structures. He has accomplished this adroitly through his innovative classroom instruction. Still, it has been his tireless efforts to cultivate and sustain connections with industry leaders across the country that have given his students the opportunity to experience first-hand the complex interrelation between the behaviors of individuals, groups, and organizations. The result is an inspired, interdisciplinary approach to problem-solving that is as valuable and illuminating as it is unique.

# RETIRING FACULTY

MITCHELL SNAY

B.A., UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN; PH.D., BRANDEIS UNIVERSITY  
PROFESSOR OF HISTORY EMERITUS

Though Mitchell Snay had discovered his love of history by high school, it was a course in college on American intellectual history that provided him with deeper insights into the abolitionist movement and the overturning of slavery. Drawing parallels to his own awareness of the civil rights and racial equality movements of the '60s, his curiosity, once piqued, was unquenchable.

He pursued his bachelor's degree in history at the University of Michigan and went on to graduate school immediately after graduating. Developing a passion in this area of study so early on engendered in his life "a great deal of direction ... until one day I thought, if I keep following this, I could end up teaching," Snay recalls.

In 1986, an appointment to the faculty of Denison's Department of History allowed him to do just that. Throughout the ensuing 34 years, Snay enlightened students in subjects from the Colonial Period or Reconstruction in classes ranging from introductory survey courses to historiographical seminars. And his elevation of Denison's humanities curriculum always approached the study of American history with the same avid fascination, zeal, and scholarship with which he began his career.

Beyond the classroom, Snay reviewed the *Journal of the Early Republic* from 1998 to 2002. On campus, he served as

chair of the Department of History from 2000 to 2003, and in 2018, he became a faculty mentor to a group of Denison Posse Scholars from Chicago.

Reflecting on his time as a professor, Snay describes his most notable connection to Denison as coming through the personal relationships that were forged. He says that, with both students and fellow faculty members, what stands out are, "... the many conversations where I would sit in my office and get to know someone ... sometimes over history, but often the gift of just getting to know each other." The decision to retire made these conversations feel all the more special, but he asserts that he leaves the department "... in good hands and with hope that these traditions will continue."

In retirement, Mitchell says he looks forward to sleeping later, having Sundays to watch football, and discovering new things — only as a true lifelong scholar would. As a baseball fanatic, he eagerly anticipates being able to attend opening-day games at Wrigley Field in Chicago. And with countless friendships developed over more than three decades as a member of faculty, he will continue to be an active member of the Denison family and the Central Ohio community.

# RETIRING FACULTY

CYNTHIA A. TURNBULL

Looking back, Cynthia Turnbull's fascination with the design and construction of costumes seems instinctive. Her mother, an excellent seamstress, taught her to sew at an early age. She studied music and theatre at Nebraska Wesleyan University as a performer, but was immersed further in the world of costume-making through a job and mentorship. Several subsequent years were spent learning from hands-on experience in professional theatre costume shops. After that, she went on to the University of Texas in Austin to pursue her M.F.A. in theatrical design.

Turnbull has designed costumes for more than 200 productions — over 60 of which have occurred at Denison — and in that time, she has designed some 2,300 costumes. Her areas of personal interest include the development of costumes created with textural layers of recycled fabric, embroidery, and paint. Her designs have earned numerous accolades, and her work has been honored with state, regional, national, and international recognition.

Since 1996, wearing numerous hats at Denison with equal dedication enabled Turnbull to contribute to the realm of

theatre at the college in countless ways. She is responsible for building the Department of Theatre's remarkable and historic costume collection. Through varying roles as designer, technician, and director, and chair of the department, she taught and mentored hundreds of students in the shop and with departmental productions. Of her accomplishments as a professor of theatre and resident costume designer, Turnbull is fittingly most proud of building Denison's costume program to the prominent position it currently holds.

In retirement, Cindi looks forward to a slightly slower pace of life. Time previously spent teaching and designing costumes for four shows every year will be redirected to gardening and experimenting with fiber art projects in her home studio. She admits, though, that she will miss the Denison students, professional colleagues, and sense of community.
