- Temporarily with another family (relative or friend) because the student or the student's family has/had nowhere else to go (This commonly is referred to as living "doubled up".)
- In a motel or hotel
- In a shelter (such as SAFE House, the Safe Place program at Link House, Hope Haven Ministries for Women and Children, &/or Family Promise, formerly known as the Interfaith Hospitality Network of Greater Kingsport)
- Unsheltered (in a tent or car) or in substandard conditions (i.e., homes without adequate space or essential utilities for an extended period of time)

- The student was thrown out of his/her home, ran away or willingly left home and lives/has lived in any of the situations described above
- The student's family is at risk of being evicted within the next week
- The student's home is in foreclosure
