

Dr. Cristóbal Salinas, Jr.

Cristóbal Salinas Jr., Ph.D., is an associate professor in the Educational Leadership and Research Methodology Department at Florida Atlantic University's College of Education. He is the founder-editor of the *Journal Committed to Social Change on Race and Ethnicity* and currently serves as the Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Hispanic Higher Education*. Dr. Salinas has published more than 75 manuscripts in print, including 6 books, and has delivered over 200 lectures.

His prolific writing and research has illuminated the importance of understanding and addressing Latino/a/x student identity and development, and made Salinas sought after by media outlets such as CNN, NBC News, NPR, Telemundo, National Review, Chemistry World, Good Morning America, and the Chronicle in Higher Education. The New York Times said his research is "futuristic," and Diverse Issues in Higher Education said, "Salinas' a rising star in academe, [and] An expert on Latinx students in college," in their special issue where he was named one of the top 15 scholars of the year. A distinguished scholar and advocate, Salinas has been awarded over 30 international and national awards for his commitment to social justice, diversity, equity, and inclusion.
