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Storyline:

Students understand that since they are created in God's image they are created to create. The most important thing they can create is artwork that tells God's story and reflects God's image.





Throughlines:

Beauty Creating- Students are creating beautiful artwork that displays their diverse personality and creativity. God created them special and unique and they can reflect that in their artwork.

Image Reflecting- Students reflect their ability to create. By creating they are reflecting their creator. Creating an artwork that shows the good news is reflecting God's love and greatness.

God-worshipping-Students are worshipping God in their Gospel story creations. Celebrating the glory and righteousness of God.

INVITE

I told each class of students the gospel story in 10 different ways over 10 weeks. Juggling, active drawing, and personal artwork were some of the ways. We also discussed the gospel and why we need to know it.

- Students were encouraged to be creative in their visual telling of the gospel.

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






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Why is it Important to share the gospel in art or in

Teacher Reflections:
