1 AN ACT 2 relating to an academic distinction designation for high student 3 achievement under the public school accountability system. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 39.202, Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: Sec. 39.202. ACADEMIC 7 DISTINCTION **DESIGNATIONS** [DESIGNATION] FOR DISTRICTS AND CAMPUSES. (a) The commissioner by 8 rule shall establish an academic distinction designation for 9

11 postsecondary readiness. The commissioner shall adopt criteria for

districts and campuses for outstanding performance in attainment of

- 12 the designation under this $\underline{\text{subsection}}$ [$\underline{\text{section}}$], including:
- 13 (1) percentages of students who:
- 14 (A) performed satisfactorily, as determined
- 15 under the college readiness performance standard under Section
- 16 39.0241, on assessment instruments required under Section
- 39.023(a), (b), (c), or (l), aggregated across grade levels by
- 18 subject area; or

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- 19 (B) met the standard for annual improvement, as
- 20 determined by the agency under Section 39.034, on assessment
- 21 instruments required under Section 39.023(a), (b), (c), or (l),
- 22 aggregated across grade levels by subject area, for students who
- 23 did not perform satisfactorily as described by Paragraph (A);
- 24 (2) percentages of:

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- 1 (A) students who earned a nationally or
- 2 internationally recognized business or industry certification or
- 3 license;
- 4 (B) students who completed a coherent sequence of
- 5 career and technical courses;
- 6 (C) students who completed a dual credit course
- 7 or an articulated postsecondary course provided for local credit;
- 8 (D) students who achieved applicable College
- 9 Readiness Benchmarks or the equivalent on the Preliminary
- 10 Scholastic Assessment Test (PSAT), the Scholastic Assessment Test
- 11 (SAT), the American College Test (ACT), or the ACT-Plan assessment
- 12 program; and
- 13 (E) students who received a score on either an
- 14 advanced placement test or an international baccalaureate
- 15 examination to be awarded college credit; and
- 16 (3) other factors for determining sufficient student
- 17 attainment of postsecondary readiness.
- 18 (b) In addition to the distinction designation described by
- 19 Subsection (a), the commissioner by rule shall establish an
- 20 academic distinction designation for districts and campuses for
- 21 outstanding performance in attainment of high student achievement.
- 22 The commissioner shall adopt criteria for the designation under
- 23 this subsection, including percentages of students who:
- 24 (1) have earned a diploma after not more than three and
- 25 one-half years of high school attendance;
- 26 (2) in grade seven or eight, complete a pre-advanced
- 27 placement course or pre-international baccalaureate course;

- 1 (3) have been promoted to higher grade levels than the
- 2 grade levels to which the students would ordinarily be assigned;
- 3 (4) are identified as gifted and talented and have
- 4 been promoted to higher grade levels than the grade levels to which
- 5 the students would ordinarily be assigned;
- 6 (5) have received credit by examination;
- 7 (6) are identified as gifted and talented and have
- 8 received credit by examination; and
- 9 (7) complete not less than 10 project-based learning
- 10 projects during a school year.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
