The Human Service Zones throughout North Dakota help vulnerable North Dakotans of all ages maintain or enhance their quality of life, which may be threatened by lack of financial resources, emotional crises, disability conditions, or an inability to protect oneself. This department provides programs in the following areas: Adults and Aging, Child Support Enforcement, Children and Family Services, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Healthy Steps, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LiHEAP), Medical, Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Services for Individuals with Disabilities, and Medicaid.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides nutrition benefits to supplemental the food budget of qualifying families. Benefits are issued on EBT cards and can only be used to buy food products at grocers, farmers' markets and other USDA-approved vendors.

Child Care Assistance Program

The Child Care Assistance Program CCAP helps pay a portion of the cost of childcare for working families, or families in training or education programs. In most cases, families pay a co-payment, which goes towards the cost of care. A co-payment is determined on a sliding fee scale based on a family's income and household size.
