

Peace is much desired, but hard to obtain

Everyone wants peace, even those at war want peace. Often, wars are justified because they seek to establish peace. The Mahabharatha war in ancient India was waged as a last resort in the name of dharma—for restoring legitimate rights to the Pandavas.

But peace is not just absence of war. Actually, Hindu Vedic prayer chanting always ends with Om Shanti, Shanti, and Shanti. Thus, there are three types of peace. The first type is external peace—outside your place of prayer, the second, inner, mental peace, and the third universal peace. In fact, meditation is a technique to remove agitations in the mind and bring about peace of mind that lets one discover one's true self.

We need peace to make progress, to focus on improvement —both personal and societal—and for the overall wellbeing of mankind. Hindus believe in the Vedantic truth that our intrinsic nature is total Peace, Happiness and Contentment (Sat-chit-ananda) but due to delusion and ignorance, we are unable to perceive this.

If we look at the world, we see conflicts/uprisings in various parts of the world—in the Middle East, Afghanistan, Syria, Africa. Some are sporadic like in Kashmir. So are religious conflicts that often test and challenge the doctrine of co-existence and self-preservation.

Prior to globalization, conflicts were strictly localized. But political awareness and global alliances tend to spread the scope and size of conflicts. Time was what happened in Africa or Indonesia had no impact on what happens in America. With migration of population, there are Africans and Indonesians living in America and there are connections/interests at government levels. These factors make it impossible to ignore such happenings.

A look at history suggests that world peace has never existed anytime and there have been conflicts of one type or the other in various parts of the world. However, these have been localized with very little global impact.

Is peace ever possible? Perhaps, if nations transcend selfish goals and pursue a common cause such as preserving the Earth from human abuse.

Holi: The Feast of Multidimensional Harmony and Divine Love: The Yajna and Yoga for All

In the age of prevailing conflicts, confusions, emptiness, and meaninglessness, many leaders of all kinds and creedsintellectuals, social scientists, physical scientists, theologians, and politicians have suddenly started preaching about the urgent need of harmony and love within this variegated world. The irony is that these words and concepts remain evasive and elusive to most of us. In the absence of real active participation (with mind, speech, and action) in the feast of harmony and love, the entire endeavor of leaders of all colors and creeds appears to be nothing more than a sonorous verbiage-an utter nominalism. Do we have an opportunity for such a feast of inviting harmony and unalloyed love? Yes, we do! And that is what the Holi is all about

The historical origin of Holi is still shrouded in mystery; however, many good indications place it in very remote times, all the way back when Bhagavan Krishna spent his miraculous and divine playful boyhood in Vrindavan, Braj-Bhoomi, India (more than 5000 years ago). Its current traditions and practices appear to have evolved from harmonizing of many dharmic, adhyatmic, social, and folk traditions.

The Holi celebration begins with a bonfire. The bonfire is started by collecting, from every house in the village, the accumulated trash, garbage, and waste. This clean-up act is the reminder of the necessity of cleaning all the physical, as well as mental, spaces where lots of polluting elements have grown out of our material nature, such as uncontrolled sensual desires, anger, delusion, hatred, violence, lust, and greed. People gather around the bonfire and make offerings that might include roasting pair of new, still green barley crops which are still in the fields (this act is a kind of Vedic Yagna), and sing and dance around the fire, with songs, including the chants written in local vernacular. After all, this is New Year's Day; a day to welcome the most colorful, joyful spring season-the king of all seasons. This is the Holika-Dahan.

In the Braj-Bhoomi, Holi playing is a battle of divine love. Young wives of the village are ready to attack the best men of the village with their sticks. It is time for colors; the wet and dry, all kinds. Everyone has been transfigured; no one is recognizable; the whole Braj-Bhoomi appears to be in great social turmoil, chaos, craziness, and good humor--yet everyone is in a state of great joy.

The erotic mood is in full swing, yet within the expanded bounds of ethical and moral norms. People are impersonating Shri Radha and Krishna; the roles have been reversed; the genders gone astray. This continues for a day or two, and then purification and restructuring starts by washing, cleaning up, and donning new clothes. This is a new beginning. Everyone greets one another with a new promise of cooperation, support, and love for the rest of the year. Radha-Krishna Bhajans (devotional songs) go on with joyful celebrations, with intense divine passion and love (Bhakti Yoga), after all, the Holi of Krishna is no mere intellectual exercise; no mere theory of love, no mere academic play: rather it is Divine Lila that each one of us must actively participate in and play our respective sva-dharmic roles with great passion and joy.

The richness, variety, and beauty of Holi Colors are the metaphors for the colors and the moods of five basic elements of Prakriti (material Nature), the changing world, seasons, and mind-an aspect of Divine Shakti Maya. The new beginning, the adhyatmic renewal for a better future for all must start by smearing out and covering up all worldly, social and physical and mental distinctions and categories. The Holi celebration tends to transcend all the established differences and diversity of varna, caste, color, sex, wealth, power, and attitudes. The social destruction and renewal. world pollution purification, smearing out the diversity to re-enact harmony and unity occur, not only on intellectual planes but it is played out physically and mentally by each and everyone with great joy. After all, it is Krishna-the Holi ofRadhafeast of multidimensional harmony and divine love.

Gurukul Admission Procedure 2019-2020

The Online registration for Gurukul begins on Saraswati Puja day, February 10, 2019, and it closes on March 3, 2019

Admission Priority: Priority will be given to those who are already enrolled in Gurukul in 2018-19 academic year (Existing Gurukul students) and have maintained 75% attendance and have scored minimum 75% marks. New students will be admitted based on the first-come-first-served basis.

Curriculum: Temple offers programs to relate with Hindu Dharma, language, and culture. In the academic year 2019-2020, Temple will offer Hindu Dharma and Culture, Hindi, Telugu, Tamil, Gujarati, Sanskrit, and Carnatic Music to those children who are six years old on August 31, 2019. Besides these programs, Temple also offers SAT to 15-17 aged students.

Communication: The Temple uses email as its primary and only means of communication. We recommend that you check your spam folders. Temple is not responsible if you didn't get email due to wrong spelling of your email, and/or blocking mass email on your server.

Sibling: If you wish to register more than one children in your family to register, you must complete online registration for each child.

Admission Requirements: (1) Age: 6 years as of August 31, 2019, (2) Membership: Parents of existing students must renew their membership by February, 24, 2019. New students' parents will be requested to come to the Temple on a specific Sunday to pay for membership and cost of books. (3) Gurukul admission will not be processed without Temple membership. Temple recommends that you renew your membership, update your email and phone number, and other personal information to ensure you receive all important communications, on time.

Admission Notice: Completing online registration does not guarantee admission to the Gurukul program. The Education Committee admits students based on many factors, including but not limited to, seats available in a classroom, classroom availability, teachers' availability, etc., and occasionally the class time may change to accommodate more students.

Agreement & Understanding:

- 1. You agree to the policies and guidelines set forth in the Temple's Gurukul Handbook posted on http://www.columbushindutemple.org/publicationandnewsletters.aspx.
- 2. You agree to bring your children every Sunday to attend classes at least 10 minutes prior to their classes begin, and will work with your child to complete the assigned homework.
- 3. You agree to pay \$20-25 per subject (except Tamil language for which you pay \$40), to defray the cost for books, printing materials, and other activities.
- 4. You agree to attend parent's orientation (upon your child's acceptance into the Gurukul program) and parent-teacher conference on August 24 at 11 AM.
- 5. You understand that even after getting admission, your child's seat may be forfeited due to continued absence and his/her seat may be offered to a wait listed student.

Registration Process: Registration is a 3 step process. The first step is to complete online registration (Paper forms will not be accepted). The 2nd step is that you will receive an email to come to the Temple and pay your membership (if not paid already) and cost of the books. At this point, the admission is provisional. And, the last and final step is that you will receive an email from the Temple that your children' admission is confirmed. The classes begin on August 25, 2019

Executive Committee approval is required for the following Services:

- (1) Between 60 to 99 miles: Individuals will pay \$150 + Puja Charge(s); Religious Institutions will pay \$250/day + Priests' transportation charges.
- (2) Between 100 to 180 miles: Individuals will pay \$250 + Puja Charge(s); Religious Institutions will pay \$250/day + Priests' transportation charges.
- (3) Beyond 180 miles and/or out of state: Individuals will pay \$250 per day + Puja Charge(s) + Priest's transportation; Religious Institutions will pay \$250 to \$400 per day + Priests' transportation charges.

NOTE: Temple humbly requests devotees to begin the Puja on scheduled time and not hold the priests beyond the completion of their religious services. Any such delay is subject to \$51/hr in addition to the service charges above as it disrupts the schedule and appointment times of the other devotees.
